Principles from Isaiah Ch. 33

- “But Lord, be merciful to us, for we have waited for you. Be our strength each day and our salvation in times of trouble.” Vs. 2

Principles from Isaiah Ch. 34

- “Search the book of the Lord, and see what he will do.” Vs. 16

Principles from Isaiah Ch. 35

- Hope for Restoration (finally!)
- “For waters shall burst forth in the wilderness, and streams in the desert.” Vs. 6b

Principles from Isaiah Ch. 36

- Satan tries to confuse and deceive us. People don’t necessarily need to be sinful to be ineffective for God; they need only be confused about what God wants. (NLT Study Bible)

Principles from Isaiah Ch. 37

- Hezekiah had persistent faith! He positioned himself in prayer and “spread his problem out before he Lord.” Vs. 14

Principles from Isaiah Ch. 38

- Hezekiah had a God-centered purpose. “Now I will walk humbly throughout my years.” Vs. 15
“Each generation can make known your faithfulness to the next.” Vs. 19

Principles from Isaiah Ch. 39

- Pride took over where discernment should have prevailed.
- Hezekiah developed a lack of spiritual awareness. He did not finish strong.

Principles from Isaiah Ch. 40

- “He gives power to the weak, And to those who have no might He increases strength. Even the youths shall faint and be weary, And the young men shall utterly fall, But those who wait on the LORD Shall renew their strength; They shall mount up with wings like eagles. They shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.” (NKJV)
