Isaiah | Debbie Stuart | 2.14.23

Chapters 13-23 are about God's continued call to repentance and God's people continuing to disobey and rebel.

Principles from Isaiah Ch. 17

- God's chosen people did not choose Him.
- They were: self-reliant, self-sufficient, self-centered and self-indulgent.

Principles from Isaiah Ch. 18

- Do not entertain thoughts and make plans contrary to the will of God.
- Application: Do you make plans and decisions and ask God to bless them?

Principles from Isaiah Ch. 19

- God confused their plans and sent a spirit of foolishness on them. (vs. 3 & 14)

Principles from Isaiah Ch. 20

- Do not depend on other people and other sources for your deliverance.
- At times God will ask His people to do illogical and unusual things to display His power.
- John 9: There was a problem. God had a process! Work God's process!

Principles from Isaiah Ch. 21

- 3 examples of Faithfulness:
 - a. The woman in travail - remain faithful when it is not easy - when it is painful. (vs. 1-4)
 - b. The threshing floor - God's people were crushed due to disobedience. (vs. 10)
 - c. The watchmen - while the prophet was warning the people, they were carelessly feasting and only thinking of themselves. They did not heed warnings. (vs. 5-9, 11-17)

Principles from Isaiah Ch. 22

- Vs. 11b - But all your feverish plans are to no avail because you never ask God for help.

Principles from Isaiah Ch. 23

- Mercy was given but evidently judgement came due to their unwillingness to repent.
- Application: Examine your life. Are there areas of pride, self-sufficiency and unwillingness to follow God?

Principles from Isaiah Ch. 24

- God's people forfeited Divine direction. In judgement, there was a remnant that praised God. This chapter prophecy's there will be a final judgement on the Earth.
