PRAYER PROMPT

A practice that strengthens your prayer life and cultivates natural conversation and communication with the Lord. It invites reflection and a starting point for personal prayer.

Prayer Prompt:

A word, phrase or truth from Scripture that can be directed into a prayer.

Example of a Prayer Prompt

- "God, I am thankful for..." or "Please give me patience when..."
- Psalm 23

Word: Shepherd

Prayer Prompt: Lord, thank You for being my Shepherd. Lead and guide me today and help me trust Your guidance and direction.

Write out Philippians 4:6 (from your translation)

CSB - Don't worry about anything, but in everything, through prayer and petition with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.

NLT - Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need and thank Him for all He has done.

The Message - Don't fret or worry. Instead of worrying, pray. Let petitions and praises shape your worries into prayers, letting God know your concerns. Before you know it, a sense of God's wholeness, everything coming together for good, will come and settle you down. It's wonderful what happens when Christ displaces worry at the center of your life.

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COME FOLLOW ME

We know that the Disciples were actually called by Jesus three different times before they left everything and followed Him.

The First Call - John 1:37-42

Many of them knew of Jesus and had heard His word, and they considered themselves followers of Jesus.

The Second Call - Matthew 4:18-22

They were preparing to cast their nets to fish, and when Jesus called, we know they stopped preparing their nets and followed Him around but they continued being fishermen.

The Third Call - Luke 4:5

Peter, James, and John were having no luck fishing until Jesus told them to cast their nets in a certain place, and then they caught more fish than they ever had. This time they left their big catch, landed their boat, left everything and followed Him wherever He went as He told them.

How does Jesus call us? How can we know for sure it is Jesus we are listening to? In 2 Timothy 3:16-17 we are told "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work." Committing to grow in your relationship with God through Bible reading, prayer and study will help you recognize and respond to the hinge-point moments God sends your way.

As He did with the Disciples, Jesus continued to teach and lead these men, and He will continue to teach, lead, and disciple us as well. Seek to truly have a close relationship with Our Lord, and His voice will be clear.

Which of the 20 Truths we have studied will you commit to start? Perhaps you are well on your way with many of them and are excited to continue as the Lord disciplines you. Be aware of "What ifs that freeze you" and the "Even IF choices" you make so that you are able to respond with grit and grace, perseverance, patience, and faith.
