## Home Group Discussion Guide

Title - Jesus the True Wisdom of God

Text - Luke 20:20-44

The purpose of the HG Discussion Guide is to help us put into practice what we learned from God's Word on Sunday morning. It also provides a place for us to share how God challenged us, encouraged us, and spoke to us through His Word. Focus on daily practical application as you share your answers with your HG.

Start by reading over this week's passage.

**Context:** Many people follow a "Jesus" of their own imagination — one who fits their preferences or politics rather than the Jesus of the Bible. Just like the crowds on Palm Sunday, we can celebrate Jesus one day and reject Him the next when He doesn't meet our expectations.

## Discussion:

What are some ways you see our culture reshaping Jesus today? How can we make sure our understanding of Him comes from Scripture and not from convenience, tradition, or social trends?

**Context:** Jesus pointed to the image on the coin and said to give Caesar what bears his image — and to give God what bears His. Since we bear God's image, that means our lives ultimately belong to Him.

**Discuss:** What are areas of life we tend to "keep for ourselves" instead of giving to God — our time, resources, relationships, priorities? What would it look like this week to truly render yourself to God in one of those areas?

**Context:** The religious leaders tried to outsmart Jesus and failed. He saw through every trick and answered with perfect wisdom. We often face questions that don't make sense — about suffering, unanswered prayer, or why God allows certain things. **Discuss:** How can remembering Jesus' perfect wisdom help you rest even when you don't have answers? Can you share a time when trusting Him through confusion grew your faith?

**Context**: The Sadducees mocked the idea of resurrection, but Jesus taught that eternal life is not just a continuation of this one — it's completely new and free from death, sin, and sorrow.

**Discuss:** How should believing in resurrection and eternity shape our daily perspective — how we grieve, how we prioritize, or how we invest our lives? What's one area of life where you need to live more in light of eternity?

Share one truth you have learned from this passage that you could pass on to someone else. It could be helping to disciple a friend, spouse, child, or even a seeking neighbor.
