REFLECTION

Mathew 25:41-46

Our scripture for this week is a sobering reminder that our faith must be lived out through active love and service. In the United Methodist membership vows, we promise to support the Church with our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness; this passage especially calls us to honor that commitment through service. Jesus teaches that when we care for those who are hungry, thirsty, sick, imprisoned, or overlooked, we are caring for Christ. Our service is not simply another responsibility on a list—it is a response to God’s grace and a visible expression of the love we have received. This Scripture challenges us to notice the needs around us and to use our time, compassion, and abilities to make a difference. As members of Christ’s Church, may we faithfully serve “the least of these,” trusting that every act of mercy becomes an act of love offered to Jesus.

DISCUSSION

1. Jesus names very ordinary acts—feeding, giving drink, welcoming, clothing, caring, and visiting. What ordinary acts of service might God be inviting you to notice or participate in?
2. In Matthew 25:41–46, Jesus connects how we treat people in need with how we treat Christ. What does this teach us about the importance of service?
3. If Jesus tells us that whatever we do for the “least of these” we do for Christ, how might that change the way we understand our United Methodist vow to serve the world?

To confess Jesus Christ as Savior, put their whole trust in his grace, and promise to serve him as their Lord;

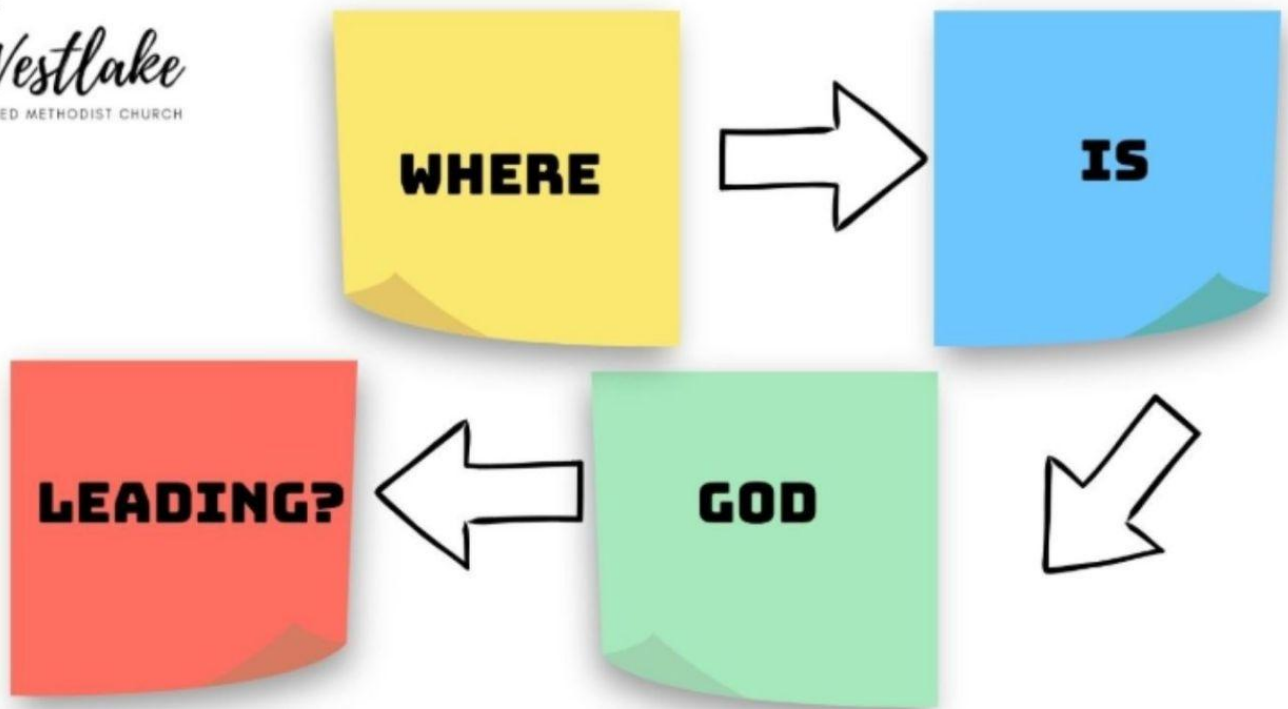
To remain faithful members of Christ's holy church and serve as Christ's representatives in the world;
