Vision Leak

December begins our season of advent! The word advent is Latin for "the coming" or "the arriving". It is during this time that we remember the arrival of our Savior and look forward to his 2nd coming. The Advent wreath is a tradition that I first experienced in my home. Growing up Christmas was always about the birth of Jesus. Though I loved the gifts, lights, and food; I knew that none of that was as important as taking time to remember that God came in human flesh to save us from our sin and reconcile us to our Creator.

Christmas wreaths, like the Christmas tree, had their origin from Christian vikings, who applied the evergreen tree branches to the Christmas/advent tradition. In the middle ages candles were placed on the wreath to represent various aspects of advent. Each of the four weeks before Christmas, a candle would be lit with a devotional reading connecting the candles to attributes of the advent season: hope, peace, love and joy. Later a white candle was added to the middle of the wreath and lit on Christmas eve to symbolize the birth of Jesus Christ.

The practice of advent was not predominantly Catholic as many believe. Lutherans, Anglicans, and Orthodox all had variations of advent in their Christmas season church gatherings.

One encouragement that we should take from the advent tradition is that it has always been a <u>Christian</u> tradition. This is not a pagan practice that was assimilated into a Christian version of Christmas celebration. Instead it has become a symbolic way of heightening senses and emotions to set the stage for the wonder and celebration of the birth of Christ.

At its core, the advent wreath and candles are a message of the gospel, packed inside a Christmas tradition that stirs up excitement about Christ who has come and Christ who will come again.
