Nepali Children of Prisoners Needing Sponsorship
2013-2014

Sonam Lama has just completed Class 12 successfully and will begin a bachelor program in either social work or sociology in November 2013. Though the youngest of three sons, he is the first in his family to be educated. When he finishes school, he “wants to help people” in a social service organization. Sonam needs \$2200 to complete his \$3000 scholarship for this coming year.	
Nakul Tamang has also completed his Class 12 studies and will be pursuing either a medical degree (pending medical school admission) or a bachelor degree in environmental science beginning in November 2013. Nakul needs \$1400 to complete his \$3000 scholarship for this coming year for an environmental science program. Medical school costs are yet to be determined.	
Hem Tamang is in his first year of a four year bachelor program in civil engineering. His father is a “foreign worker” who sends home remittances from abroad to try to support his family. Hem wants to help develop the hydro power which Nepal desperately needs. Hem needs \$1500 to complete his \$3000 scholarship for this school year.	

Milan Lama is currently working to complete his GED high school certificate so he can continue his studies in a bachelor program in English. While his mother wants him to work overseas and send money home, his father, who has been working overseas, is encouraging him to complete his studies. He is a bright, gentle young man who wants to use his ability with English language to help people through an international non-governmental organization.

Milan needs \$1700 to complete his \$2500 scholarship for this school year.



Binod Shreemal is an orphaned student whose father died in prison. Binod is completing his first year of a bachelor program in medical microbiology. His likely direction is in the field of public health.

Binod needs \$1000 to complete his \$3000 scholarship for the coming school year.



Arjun Parajuli has recently completed Class 12 and is set to begin his first year in a bachelor program in civil engineering. He is a particularly bright and thoughtful young man who wants to use his degree to help Nepal develop. Until two years ago, he had never met his parents or siblings.
