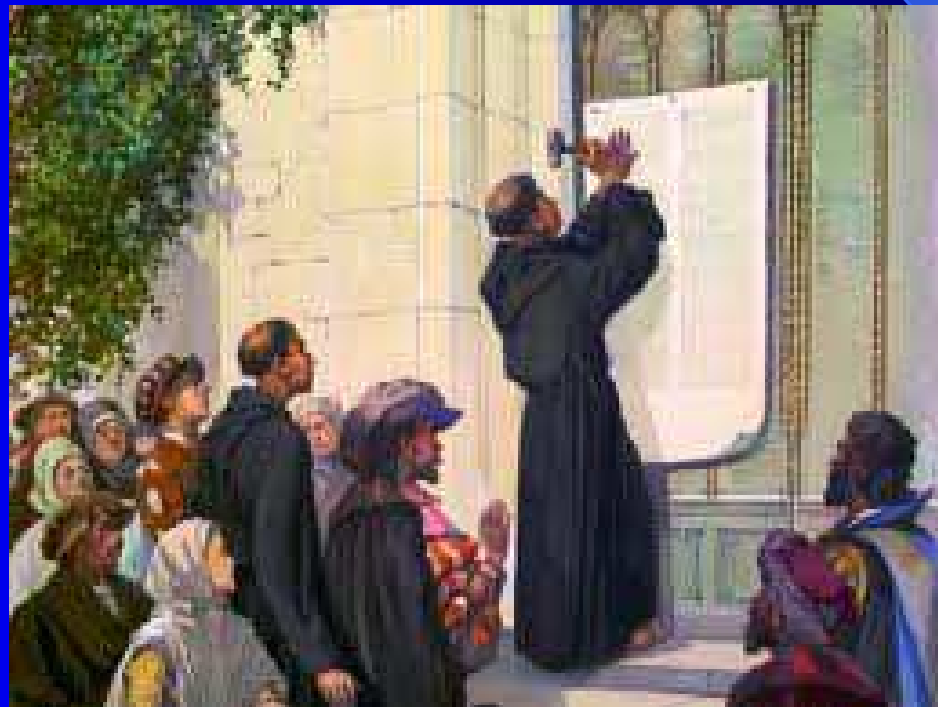

"HE BEING DEAD, YET SPEAKS." Two years after Luther died, Spanish Catholic troops entered Wittenberg, where this painting hangs. A soldier pierced the preaching Luther at the neck and shouted, "Even in death this beast rages on!" The cuts in the painting are still visible; so is Luther's enormous influence.

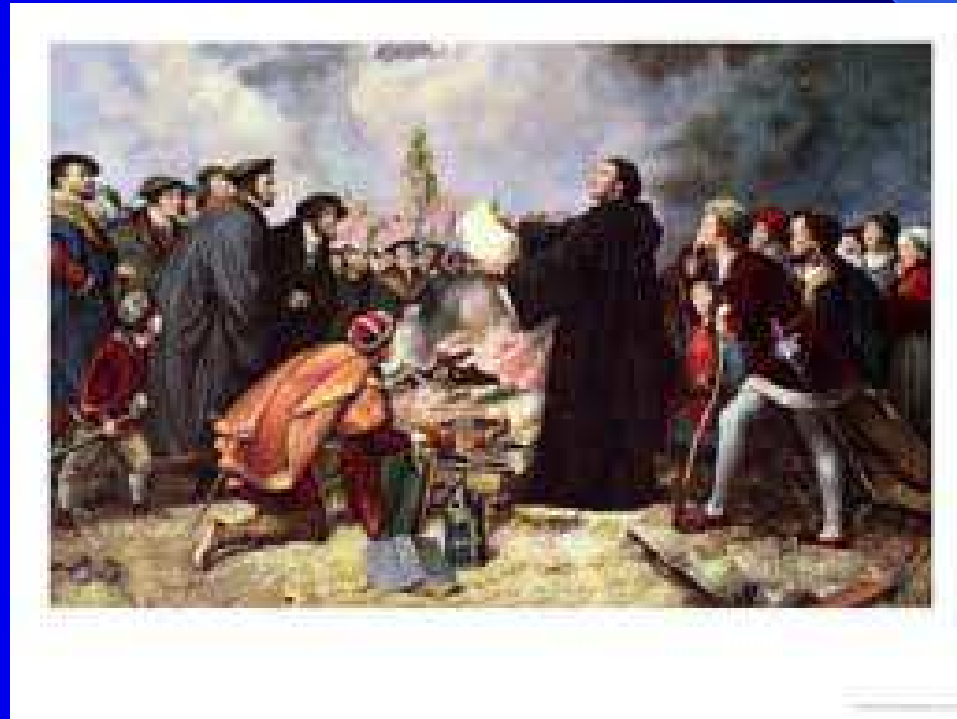

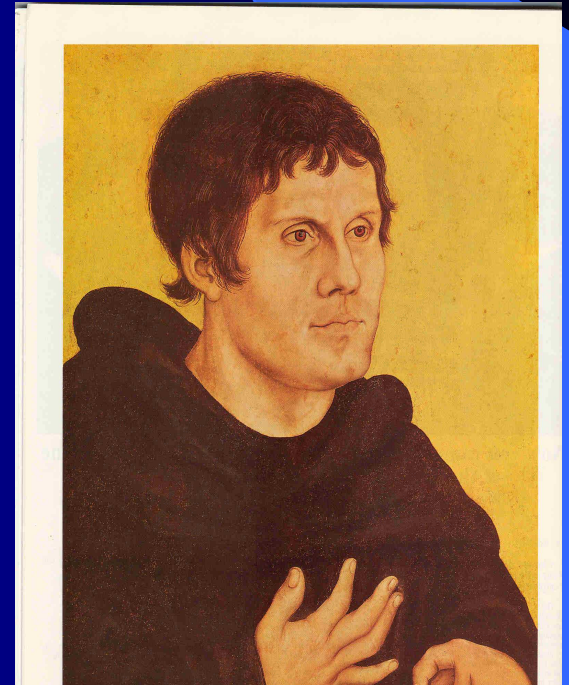
