THE FORM

Teaching is often **dialogical**:
a back-and-forth exchange.

Preaching is most often
monological: one-to-many.

THE MODE

Teaching is the **explanation**
of biblical truth.

Preaching extends beyond
explanation to include **proclamation**
of biblical truth.

THE SETTING

Teaching takes place
in **smaller settings within the church**.
(Sunday morning/community groups)

Preaching happens when **the entire church is gathered**.

THE TONE

Teaching tends to have
a **measured and even tone**.

Preaching often carries a **heightened sense of earnestness**.

THE POSTURE

Teaching comes from a **peer posture** –
like coaching.

Preaching comes from a
recognized **position of authority**.

THE GOAL

Teaching is concerned
with **information & education**.

Preaching drives toward
an **invitation & response**.
