

Remember: DO NOT INCLUDE: candy, toothpaste, gum, food, seeds, used or damaged items, war-related items, liquids or lotions, medicine or vitamins, breakable or glass containers, and aerosol cans.

Here are Some Ideas of what to bring:

"WOW" items: i.e. ball, dolls, cars, small stuffed animals (remember it has to fit into a shoebox), yoyo's, small musical instruments, toys that light up or make noise with extra batteries, jewelry, sewing kits, fishing string, masking tape, electrical tape, small tools for older boys, etc.

Hygiene items: toothbrushes, soap, wash cloths, combs, brushes, hair barrettes and bands, etc.

School supplies: pens, pencils with sharpeners, crayons, markers, notebooks, paper, coloring books, picture books, solar calculators, etc.

Accessories: socks, sunglasses, jewelry, flashlights with batteries, flip flops, and underwear, etc.

These are just a few suggestions that might help you shop.

Discover Luncheon


