THE FAITHFULNESS OF GOD

Read **Romans 6:1-14** together.

Review

Paul begins this chapter with a rhetorical question: if grace can cover all of the sins of the world, should we continue sinning to produce even more grace? While it may seem like a silly premise, Paul uses this rhetorical question to make the argument that not only should this *not* be our approach to grace and sin, but that we, as Christians, have shifted away from sin completely into the domain of God's grace.

Discussion Questions

1. Paul begins this chapter by saying that just because grace covers over sin, we ought not continue to sin and that we have "died to sin". What does this look like? And how do you live this out in your own life?
2. Read Ephesians 1:17-20. In both of these passages, Paul attaches the believers to the resurrection of Christ. What sort of encouragement do you find in being united with Christ in His resurrection and its power?
3. What is the difference between being a slave to sin and being under grace? (v14)
