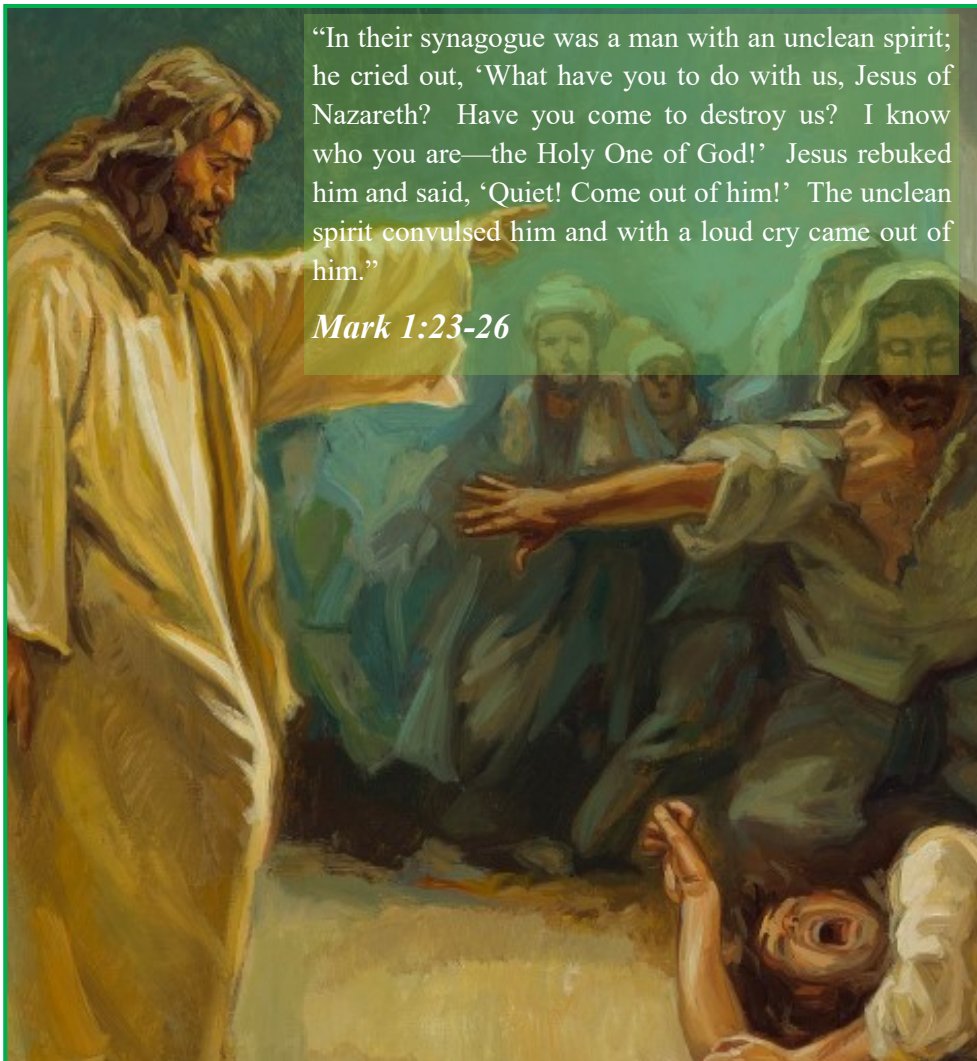

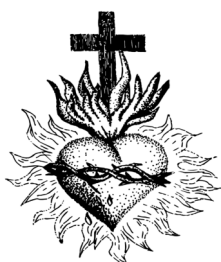

Spotlight on Veterans

Dr. Albert Kwan, U.S. Air Force



Dr. Kwan was born in Hong Kong, which at that time was a British colony. His father had no religion and his mother was Buddhist. His mother wanted to make sure he received a good education and sent him to a Catholic elementary school. He wanted to become a priest, but his mother did not like the idea that her only son would become a priest and she wanted grandchildren to carry on the family name.

In order to be baptized, students would have bible study and at the end of each session, they would take a test. If passed, you would be baptized. For whatever reason, his father would take him out of class on test day and he was never baptized. He attended a Protestant high school where he also learned Protestant teachings.

He came to the States, attended one semester at Loyola University of Los Angeles and did not like California because he did not have a car and could not have a job to support his college education. He transferred to North Carolina where he was not prepared for the cold weather and, overnight, would receive over one foot of snow. His first job was working in a restaurant performing many tasks from cutting chicken, washing dishes, cooking, waiting tables and hosting. During the summers, he would work up to three jobs to save money to pay for his own schooling and not be a financial burden to his parents.

He moved to Albuquerque in 1974 to study pharmacy and worked in a pharmacy. A priest came into the pharmacy and in conversation, Dr. Kwan expressed his interest in being baptized. The

Priest asked him if he knew the required prayers; he said yes, in Chinese, and getting to be proficient in English prayers. That was fine with the priest. He was finally baptized and confirmed to become a Catholic. His mother became very supportive of his faith journey and would attend mass with him when she came to visit. In

1974, Dr. Kwan attended UNM school of Pharmacy and became great classmates with Brian Willmon from Clovis and later also medical school together. Both graduated from Pharmacy School in 1977 and Medical School in 1983. They have been good friends since and it took Dr. Kwan a couple of attempts to be accepted to Medical School. He learned that because his family was back in California, the school was concerned with him leaving New Mexico to be with his family, since it was a state funded medical school with priority to educate physicians to serve the state. His response to the dean of admission of the medical school was

that after he graduated from Pharmacy school, he stayed in Albuquerque to work as a pharmacist. His wife was from the South Valley and his son was born in UNM Hospital. He was not planning on leaving New Mexico and wanted to help underserved areas. In appreciation for being offered an opportunity to be a physician, he made a promise to serve underserved areas and kept his promise by serving Clovis for 30 years.

In 1986, Dr. Kwan joined the United States Air Force as a medical officer during his last year of surgical training at Texas Tech University Health Science Center. Dr. Kwan joined the Air Force because he wanted to serve our great nation in gratitude for giving him an opportunity to have liberty and the pursuit of happiness.



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Dr. Kwan's most memorable time was being deployed to Desert Storm, where he served as chief of surgery in an Air Force mobile hospital. He was also Chief of Surgery at two other hospitals, McConnell AFB in Wichita, Kansas and Kirkland AFB in Albuquerque. He also served both as a surgeon and flight surgeon during his five years of active duty service. Dr. Kwan appreciates and feels it was an honor to serve his adopted country. Dr. Kwan advocates that we all should appreciate those who are serving and have served, support the military families and show respect and acknowledge what they have done in sacrifice for our nation.

Dr. Kwan is also active in medical services and health care policy in New Mexico and was elected and served as President of the New Mexico Medical Society in 2007.

Dr. Kwan received the Distinguished Alumni Award from his alma mater, U.N.M. Medical School, this year for his service to rural areas, the state and the nation and was notably honored by the city of Clovis and awarded the "KEY TO THE CITY" in June of 2023. His philosophy is "integrity over intelligence".

Dr. Kwan has been a surgeon in Clovis for 30 years, he has served as chief of surgery, president of the medical staff for ten years and the past two and half years as medical director of the hospital.

In the picture are three surgeons (Dr. Manning from Boston, Dr. McClellan from Chicago and Dr. Kwan from New Mexico). It was taken before returning home from Desert Storm. It was history in the making. His deployment experience was memorable with surgeons operating in tents. It was almost a reflection of M.A.S.H.!

Dr. Kwan has 6 children: one daughter who is a surgeon, 5 sons who are law enforcement officers, environmental engineers, nuclear pharmacists, tattoo artists and musicians.
