A Note from Shylet about the farm...

I hired a drilling company to deepen the well at the farm. Great news, we reached a level where there is plenty of water and it is actually enough for us to do some farming.

We have since planted seeds for us to get seedlings for tomatoes, vegetables (rape and tsunga), cucumbers and onions. We are also done with clearing another piece of land for us to put some maize.

Cattle now have enough water although pastures are highly likely to get depleted as the year progresses. I had to be on the ground for two weeks to get this work done. I am really happy that we made progress.
