CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIE WITH A TOUCH OF OATMEAL

Ingredients:

- 1 ½ Flour
- 1 tsp. Salt
- 1 tsp. Baking Soda
- 1 Cup Shortening
- ¾ Cup Brown Sugar
- ¾ Cup White Sugar
- 2 Eggs
- 1 tsp. Vanilla
- 2 Cups Semi-Sweet Chocolate Chips
- 2 Cups Uncooked Rolled Oats

Steps:

Sift the first 3 ingredients together (flour, salt, baking soda).

In a separate bowl, cream shortening and sugars.

In the bowl with shortening and sugars, beat in eggs + vanilla until light and fluffy.

Stir in dry ingredients, rolled oats, and chocolate chips.

Bake on an ungreased cookie sheet at 350° for 12 minutes.

GLUTEN FREE CHRISTMAS TEA CAKES

Ingredients:

Gluten Free Flour Blend (1) Cup

I like to use Bob's 1 to 1

Sweet Cream Butter (1/2) Cup

Unrefined Cane Sugar (3) Tbl

Salt (1/4) tsp

Pure Vanilla Extract (1) Tbl

Fresh *Walnuts (1) Cup

**Roughly Chopped*

Powdered Sugar (1) 16 Oz

Measure out the flour and set aside. In a mixing bowl cream, the butter, sugar, salt and vanilla. Gradually add your flour blend. Next, add in the walnuts.

Tightly pack the cookie dough in a #40 cookie scoop. Bake on a cookie sheet with parchment paper in a 325° oven for 15 minutes. Let cool for only 5 minutes on the baking tray. Then *roll (gently toss) cookie in and with the powdered sugar. Completely cool on a cooling rack.

*Make sure you have plenty of powdered sugar. Use a deep container large enough to handle all your cookies. Try a deep 9x12" dish with at least a couple of inches of powdered sugar. Carefully place several cookies into the container with room to powder each cookie. It won't hurt to leave the cookies sitting in the powdered sugar for a bit while you roll the other cookies.

These cookies will be a bit fragile until they cool so take great care in gently tossing and rolling them in the powdered sugar.

The heat of the cookie will melt the powdered sugar into a yummy creamy covering. Once they are completely cooled you can always sprinkle more powder sugar on top of each cookie if you like a uniformed look.

Christmas Yule Log

115 grams caster sugar
65 grams self-raising flour
4 large eggs (free-range)
40 grams cocoa solids
400 grams chocolate (finely chopped)
450 ml double cream
35 ml whipped cream
Garnish: powdered sugar

- Preheat the oven to 200C /180C. Grease a 33x23 cm. Swiss roll tin and line with baking parchment.
- Sift together flour and cocoa and gently fold the two together. Do not overmix.
- Whisk the eggs until fluffy and pale in color.
- Gently whisk together the wet and dry ingredients until just combined.
- Pour the cake batter into the tin. Bake for 8 to 10 min. or until the cake is golden and lightly risen.
- Cut a piece of baking parchment slightly larger than the cake. Place onto a worktop, sprinkle with icing sugar and swiftly turn the cake onto the paper.
- Starting from the top end roll the cake up with the paper on the inside.
- Add the chocolate and cream to a bowl and place over a pan of barely simmering water to melt. Once melted, put into the fridge to cool and thicken.
- Unroll the cake, spread the top side with $\frac{1}{3}$ of the chocolate cream, followed by the whipped cream and roll once more.
- Pipe the remaining cream lengthwise to cover the whole cake including the ends.
- Gently fork the chocolate cream to roughen the 'bark' slightly.
- Dust with powdered sugar.



Family Advent Devotion



WEEK 1 / GENESIS 3:1-15

From the beginning of time, God created humans to be with Him. So He gave Adam and Eve instructions. He filled the garden of Eden with delicious food, and they were free to try it all! But he instructed them to stay away from just one tree that would not be good for them. Even though God had been kind to Adam and Eve, the serpent made them doubt Him. They thought perhaps God was keeping something good from them, so they disobeyed. When they broke the only rule, their actions showed that they wanted to make their own rules instead of listening to God. This is called sin. And because God is perfect, he sent Adam and Eve away to make their own rules somewhere else. This is sad. God didn't want to send them away. So He made a promise—God promised to send someone to save the people from the evil snake and the curse of sin. He promised to send someone who would make everything right, so people could be with God again!

Have you ever tried to make your own rules instead of listening to people who love you?

Adam and Eve doubted God. Have you ever felt like that? How did you respond?

Genesis 3 is a sad story because the people are separated from God, but there is a happy ending. What is the happy ending? What does that tell you about God?



WEEK 2 / ISAIAH 9:2-7

Have you ever felt like everything was going wrong? God's people felt this way too. They were scared when their enemies started wars against them. When they felt discouraged, they asked God, "Where are you? Don't you care that our enemies are coming after us?" When it seemed like God had forgotten His promises, the people turned their backs on Him. They did things God told them not to, and they worshiped other gods. This made God sad because the people were doing things that would hurt them. So He sent prophets to warn them. When the people didn't listen, God still promised He would send a Messiah to save them. God always keeps his promises. Did today's passage sound familiar? At Christmas, we read this passage to celebrate Jesus' birth. God made this promise hundreds of years ago, before Jesus was born, even when the people were disobeying Him. But God still kept His promise!

Think of a time when you made a promise to someone or God. Did you keep it? What happened?

Can you think of a time in your life when you felt like God forgot you or everything was going wrong?

When you look back now, can you see how God was helping you?

God always keeps promises. How does this make you feel? Pray about something you need His help with.

Family Advent Devotion



WEEK 3 | MATTHEW 1:18-25

God is faithful. He never forgets His people. Throughout history, He sent prophets to promise His people that He would send a Savior. The people trusted that God's Messiah would come to save them one day. But then, God stopped sending prophets. For 400 years, the people waited and wondered if God had forgotten them. One day, an angel appeared to a young girl named Mary and told her she would give birth to the Son of God. The man she was going to marry thought she was making up a crazy story. But then, God sent an angel to tell him the news, too! From that point on, He trusted in God's plan as well. Our Bible passage today even tells us that the way this happened fulfilled one of God's promises from the prophets. The angel told Joseph to name the child Jesus. And when the baby was born, He did! So when God tells us His plan and gives us instructions, we can trust Him. Joseph did what God asked, and that's how Jesus got His name.

Why was it hard for God's people to trust that God would keep his promise?

When Joseph doubted God's plan, how did God reassure him?

Sometimes God lets us help with His plans, but doesn't explain every detail. Why was it good that Joseph named the child Jesus? How should we respond when God gives us instructions?



WEEK 4 | LUKE 2:1-18

The promises God made came true one night in Bethlehem. The Savior of the world was born! This news was so exciting that angels appeared in the sky to announce the news to shepherds nearby! Can you imagine how those shepherds must have felt? God didn't choose to share the information with kings. Instead, he first announced it to regular people, like you and me. If you've ever felt unimportant, this is good news. Just because you're not rich or powerful doesn't mean God has forgotten you. He loves you so much that He sent the world's Savior to people just like us. When the angels announced the good news, the shepherds were so excited that they ran to see the baby. And when they saw Him, they were so amazed that they went through the town telling everyone they met. The Savior of the world loves each of us personally. And when we know Jesus, we want to tell everybody that God always keeps his promises!

How do you think the shepherds felt when the sky filled with angels sharing the good news?

Why did they run to tell everyone?

The story of how Jesus came is exciting! This Christmas, who can you share this wonderful news with?

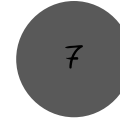
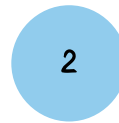

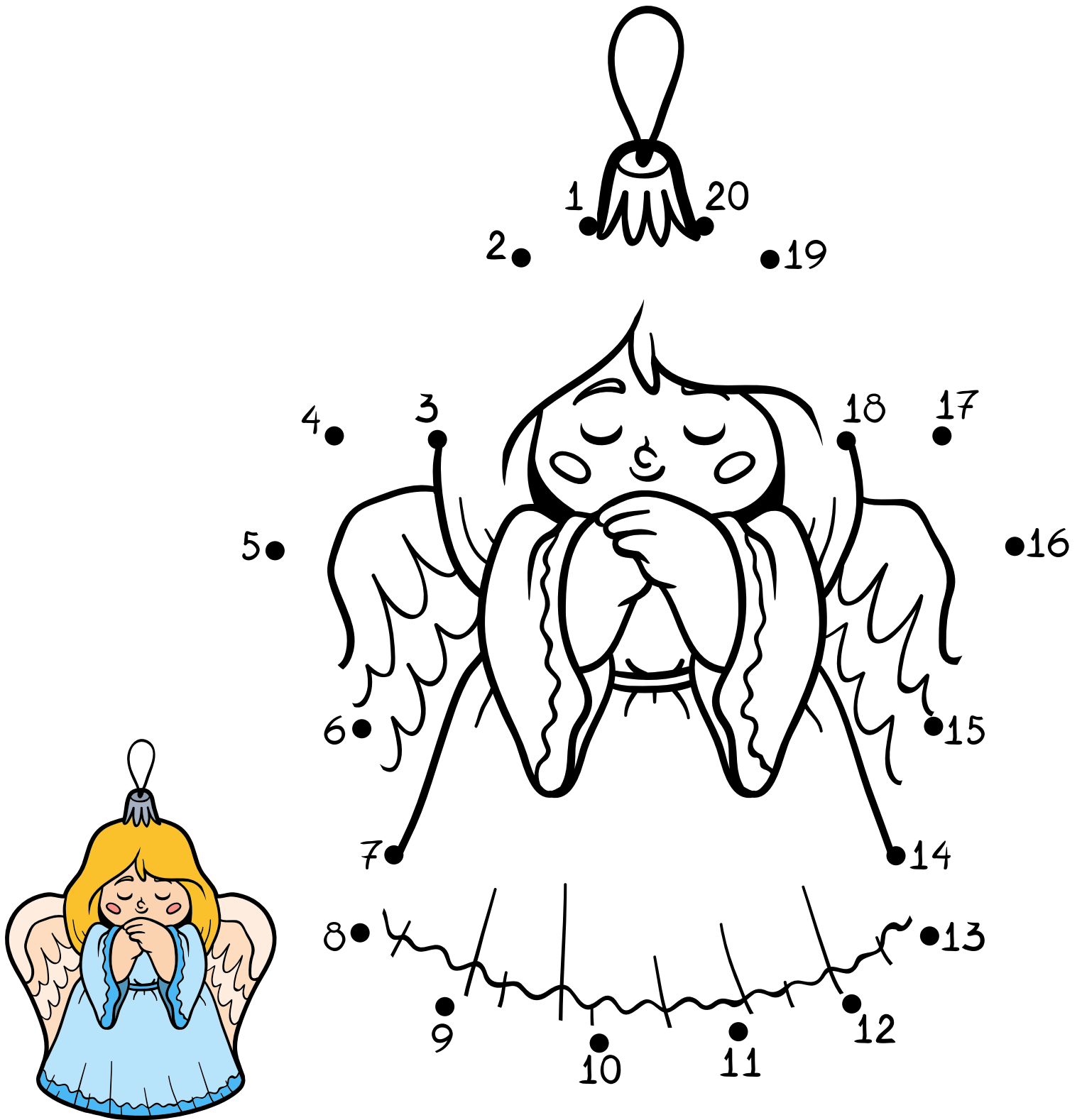
