Leviticus 12:4

ESV

⁴ Then she shall continue for thirty-three days in the blood of her purifying. She **shall not touch** anything holy, **nor come into** the sanctuary, until the days of her purifying are completed.

Leviticus 12:6–7

ESV

⁶ “And when the days of her purifying are completed, whether for a son or for a daughter, she shall bring to the priest at the entrance of the tent of meeting a lamb a year old for a burnt offering, and a pigeon or a turtledove for a sin offering, ⁷ and he shall offer it before the LORD and make atonement for her. **Then she shall be clean** from the flow of her blood. This is the law for her who bears a child, either male or female.

Leviticus 12:8

ESV

⁸ And if she cannot afford a lamb, then she shall take two turtledoves or two pigeons, one for a burnt offering and the other for a sin offering. And the priest shall make atonement for her, and she shall be clean."

Jesus left the holy place of heaven
to **touch** and **take on our mortality**.



Jesus' holiness is **incorruptible**, because
he is the ultimate reconciliation of
heaven and earth, the **ultimate temple**.



Colossians 1:19–20

ESV

¹⁹ For in him all **the fullness of God** was pleased to dwell, ²⁰ and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether **on earth or in heaven**, making peace by the blood of his cross.

Ephesians 1:10

NCV

¹⁰ His goal was to carry out his plan, when the right time came, that all things **in heaven and on earth** would be **joined together in Christ** as the head.

We never have to leave the presence of God to do good works, because we are the **temple** of the Holy Spirit and a holy **priesthood**.



1 Peter 2:4–5

NCV

⁴ Come to the Lord Jesus, the “stone” that lives. The people of the world did not want this stone, but he was the stone God chose, and he was precious.

⁵ You also are like living stones, so let yourselves be used to build **a spiritual temple**—to be **holy priests** who offer **spiritual sacrifices** to God. He will accept those sacrifices through Jesus Christ.

Hebrews 13:15–16

NLT

¹⁵ Therefore, let us offer through Jesus a continual **sacrifice of praise to God**, proclaiming our allegiance to his name. ¹⁶ And don't forget to **do good** and to **share with those in need**. These are the **sacrifices that please God**.

Romans 12:1

ESV

I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to **present your bodies as a living sacrifice**, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship.

Your **home work** is **holy work**.
