WONDER TRUTH: God Keeps His Promises

SCRIPTURE: [Genesis 18; 21](#)

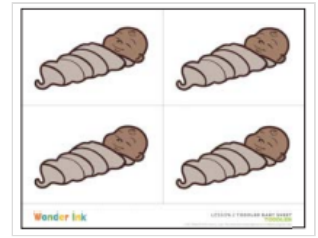

Activity: Find the Baby

SUPPLIES: scissors (prep only)

Wonder Ink RESOURCES: [Toddler Baby Sheet](#) (at least 1 copy)

Print the at least one copy of the [Toddler Baby Sheet](#) and cut apart the baby pictures. Before the kids arrive, hide several baby pictures around the room. Make sure you have enough for each child to find one (plus a few extras so the last child has more opportunity to spot one).



Our story today is about a baby. His name was Isaac. We're going to go on a hunt and find baby Isaac. Hold up a picture of baby Isaac so the kids know for what they are looking. Call each child's name and let her go look for baby Isaac and bring it back to her spot. Help guide the children in the right direction. After each child brings back one of the pictures, ask the whole group, "What is this baby's name?" Encourage them to shout out, "Isaac!"

You did an excellent job of finding baby Isaac! We're going to hear more about this baby in God's big story today! In our story, God promised a mom and dad that they would have a baby. This helps us remember our Wonder Truth.

Our Wonder Truth today is: GOD KEEPS HIS PROMISES.

Encourage the kids to do the following motions while you repeat the Wonder Truth. Older toddlers can say the words with you as they do the motions.

- **GOD**—*Point up.*
- **KEEPS**—*Wrap your arms around yourself in a hug.*
- **HIS PROMISES**—*Hold hands out in front of you, palms up.*

God's Big Story

SUPPLIES: Bible

Our God's big story today is a great story from the Bible about a man named Abraham and his wife, Sarah. Encourage the kids to say, "Abraham" and "Sarah." **Let's find out from the Bible what happened to them!**

Show the kids the [God's Big Story Video](#), read the story from the Bible, or use the script provided. You can also use the Bible Story Picture to help the kids visualize the story as it's being told.

God promised Abraham and Sarah they would have a big family. Who is in your family?

Allow kids to respond.

But there was one big problem: They were way too old to have kids!

One day God talked to Abraham through a special messenger and told him that in one year Sarah would have a baby boy. Can you hold up one finger? Encourage the kids to hold up one finger.

Sarah heard what the man said and laughed. Her ... have a baby? Can you laugh like Sarah did? Encourage the kids to laugh.

A year later, just as God promised, Sarah had a baby boy. They named him Isaac. Let's pretend to rock a baby. Allow kids to pretend to rock a baby.

God kept His promise to Abraham and Sarah. They had a baby! And God will keep His promises to us, too!

Activity: Worship Dance Party

SUPPLIES: musical instruments (optional), ribbons (optional)

Wonder Ink RESOURCES: upbeat music

Play upbeat music from the playlist and allow the kids to dance and move to the music. Consider giving them instruments or ribbons to twirl as they dance. Stop the music periodically and encourage the kids to shout, "God keeps His promises!"

Kind of like how we had to wait for the music to start before we could start dancing again, Abraham and Sarah had to wait for God to keep His promise. But today we learned that even if we must wait, God always keeps His promises!
