Pastors NOTE

Over the last couple of months, my personal devotions have been largely grounded in the first five books of the Bible. While it can be tough going, these infinitely rich books, which collectively are called the Torah, explore with profound insight what it means (and what it takes) for a fallen humanity to be in relationship with a Holy God. Concepts of righteousness, justice, sin, forgiveness, sacrifice, and judgement are all significant themes raised, as God creates, covenants, and continually calls His people back to Himself.

Another significant theme, which perhaps does not receive as much airtime as those mentioned above, is the theme of celebration. For it is in the Torah that God gives Israel the specific instructions about how they are to celebrate no less than seven different festivals! From Passover to Pentecost, and Trumpets to Tabernacles, God is eager for Israel not only to remember, but to celebrate all that He has done for them.

The question I've been pondering these past few months is, 'Why?' Why is celebration so important to God? There is much I could mention from my musings, but what I keep coming back to is this simple thought, "God is the Good Father, who gives good commands, for the good of His people."

Celebration of God's work and goodness keeps us from spiritual amnesia. It keeps us from falling into the Deuteronomy 8 trap of becoming a people who forget what the Lord has done. Celebration keeps us humble and dependent. Celebration is good for our souls. This is one of the reasons why we are introducing this new idea of the HBC newsletter, because we want to celebrate what God is doing amongst us. Rather than getting a weekly email telling you what's coming up, we will now be sending a monthly newsletter celebrating all that God has done. Don't worry, important information will still be communicated via email when necessary, but our hope is that by giving more attention to celebration, we will build a greater sense of connection with one another and awe and wonder at what God is doing in our midst.

So, welcome to the newsletter! May it serve to remind us of the goodness of God and lead us to the same proclamation as that of the Psalmist, "Not to us, O Lord, not to us, but to Your name be the glory, because of Your love and faithfulness." Psalm 115:1



Each session begins with fellowship and worship, followed by a 30-minute teaching, followed by small group discussion in huddles of 3–4, led by a dedicated mentor. Together, you'll reflect, pray, and commit to living out what God is speaking with encouragement and accountability throughout the week.






Men on a MISSION



Reflections from Residency One A SHEPHERD'S JOURNEY BEGINS

After 29 hours of travel, I arrived at Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary in Massachusetts to begin my Doctor of Ministry in Pastoral Theology. The first morning's run through the seminary grounds, bathed in red sunrise, stirred a deep sense of anticipation. I was here—not just to study, but to be formed.

The two-week residency was rich and intense. Each day began with worship, and I even led one morning with Dave Currie's old guitar—dusting off both strings and memories. We dove deep into the identity of a pastor: not just what we do, but who we are.

We explored the pastor as a person—experiencing life's joys and sorrows, only more so. Ministry intensifies everything. We are called to follow Jesus, to shepherd His people, and to be physicians of the soul. We are priests, theologians, and leaders—but above all, we are sheep before we are shepherds.

One of the most powerful sessions was on healing from leadership trauma. We shared stories—raw, honest, sacred. Though confidential, the themes were universal: loneliness, perfectionism, conflict, and the deep cost of ministry. In those sacred moments, I felt the Spirit's unity across cultures and denominations.

Throughout the residency, I kept returning to one question: What truly forms a leader? I'm convinced that spiritual formation is central. The church needs leaders who are not just competent, but Christlike. The most impactful leaders in my life weren't known for their vision or preaching, but for their character.

As I head home, I carry both challenge and hope. I've embraced my identity as both sheep and shepherd. I need the Good Shepherd's guidance, and I'm called to reflect His presence to the flock entrusted to me. I look forward to applying what I've learned at Hills Baptist and in the wider church community.

Thank you for your prayers, support, and encouragement. This journey is not mine alone —it's ours. May the gold I've received overflow into the life of our church, for God's glory.





Finance UPDATE

Overall giving is 1.2% above budget for the financial year. Giving towards the new building project continues from the all-in campaign, having raised \$15k so far this financial year. Our overall expenses are 3.5% above budget YTD, but we expect this to even out over the course of the year. Thank you for your faithful giving.

Work is progressing on the building project with KBGS. We are currently working to finalise some technical details regarding congregational voting, trust funds, and an updated memorandum of understanding with KBGS. We will be communicating with members separately regarding these as and when finalised. We are excited to see this work progressing. More information is available on our website.
