Jesus Glorified ♦ Lives Transformed ♦ Hope Revealed

Pastors NOTE

As I've been exploring the theme of Biblical consecration these past few months, I have been richly blessed not only by the Scriptures and our times of prayer and worship, but also by a variety of published works from Christian authors spanning the last hundred or so years. One of the works that has particularly captivated and challenged me is the little book, *The Pursuit of Holiness*, by Jerry Bridges (lent to me by a couple from within our church - thank you Michael and Dianne).

In it, Bridges wrestles with the question that if holiness (being consecrated unto God) is foundational to the Christian life, and is indeed the seed of our new nature in Christ (what he bought for us on the cross), then why is it that we often feel so defeated in our struggle against sin? Bridges raises several ideas in response to this, but the one that has truly caused me to pause and reflect is this one:

"Our first problem is that our attitude toward sin is more self-centred than God-centred. We are more concerned with our own "victory" over sin than we are about the fact that our sins grieve the heart of God." (The Pursuit of Holiness, 1985, page 20)

What a profound thought.

A subtle nuance, yes, but a nuance that is well worth meditating on, because what he's saying is that the key to consecration is relationship.

In fact, it's a thought that has had me singing that old hymn, Turn Your Eyes Upon Jesus, over and over.

"Turn your eyes upon Jesus, look full in His wonderful face, and the things of earth will grow strangely dim, in the light of His glory and grace."

The more our focus is on how we need to conquer our own sin, the more we will struggle with it. The more our focus is on the glory and grace of our beautiful saviour Jesus, the more we will see sin for what it is, and the more our hearts will long to honour and love him above all things.

God is calling us to consecration, which means he is calling us to revelation. He wants to show us more of himself. He wants to open our eyes to see him more clearly, our hearts to love him more dearly, and our lives to walk with him more nearly.

Lord, let it be so.

- God's heart for justice, peace, and compassion in our local community

As we come to the end of these 21 days, we're encouraged not to see this as a finish line, but as a foundation, a reminder that prayer is not just something we do for a season, but a posture we carry into everyday life.

'Fasting is to go without, the time though was more, I was filled more than I felt without. Reminded more, related more and brought closer by having less.'

'This season made me aware of the suffering of others in the world who are lucky to eat one meal a day and the enormity of Christ's suffering to give me abundant life.'

'Godliness with contentment is great gain - 1 Tim 6:6. The Lord highlighted this verse and showed me that I've become very discontented. Now I'm learning to be content with all aspects of my life.'

We give thanks to God for what He has done among us during these 21 days, and we look forward with expectation to how He will continue to lead, form, and transform us as we seek Him together.

Bollen Road Update

A lease agreement with King's is currently being prepared, which will provide Hills Baptist Church with a legal holding over the building being constructed as part of this collaborative arrangement. This lease will be referenced within a broader Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), which will outline how the space will be shared and used.

Eldership Retreat

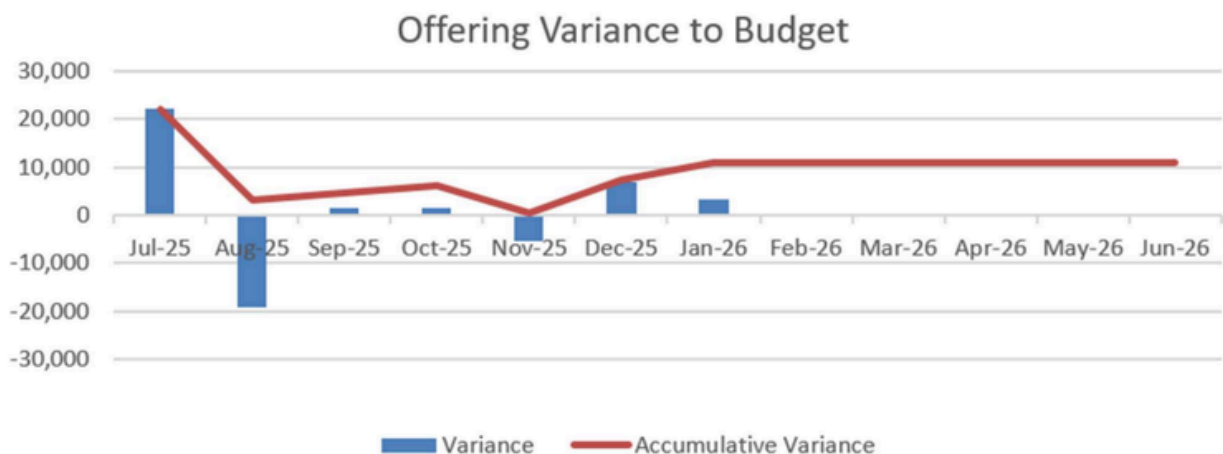

Meet ADAM WILLIAMS

Can you tell us a little about yourself and your family, and what led you into pastoral ministry?

Outside of church life, what do you enjoy doing to rest, recharge, or have fun?

Spending time with Laura over good food or getting out in nature, hanging out with friends or playing with Amos. I also have a great passion for running as it's a hobby that helps me decompress, step away from technology for a moment and enjoy the peace of just being with the Lord.

How can we be praying for you?

I would love prayer for wisdom and insight into what the Lord has next for the places and spaces of worship and prayer at HBC. That He would show, not just to me, but our entire worship team, the steps He would have us take this year towards further establishing His house as a house of prayer.

I would also appreciate prayer for the fruits of His Spirit, love, joy, peace, patience and more to abound in my life, and for Him to be the one that sustains me as I lead.

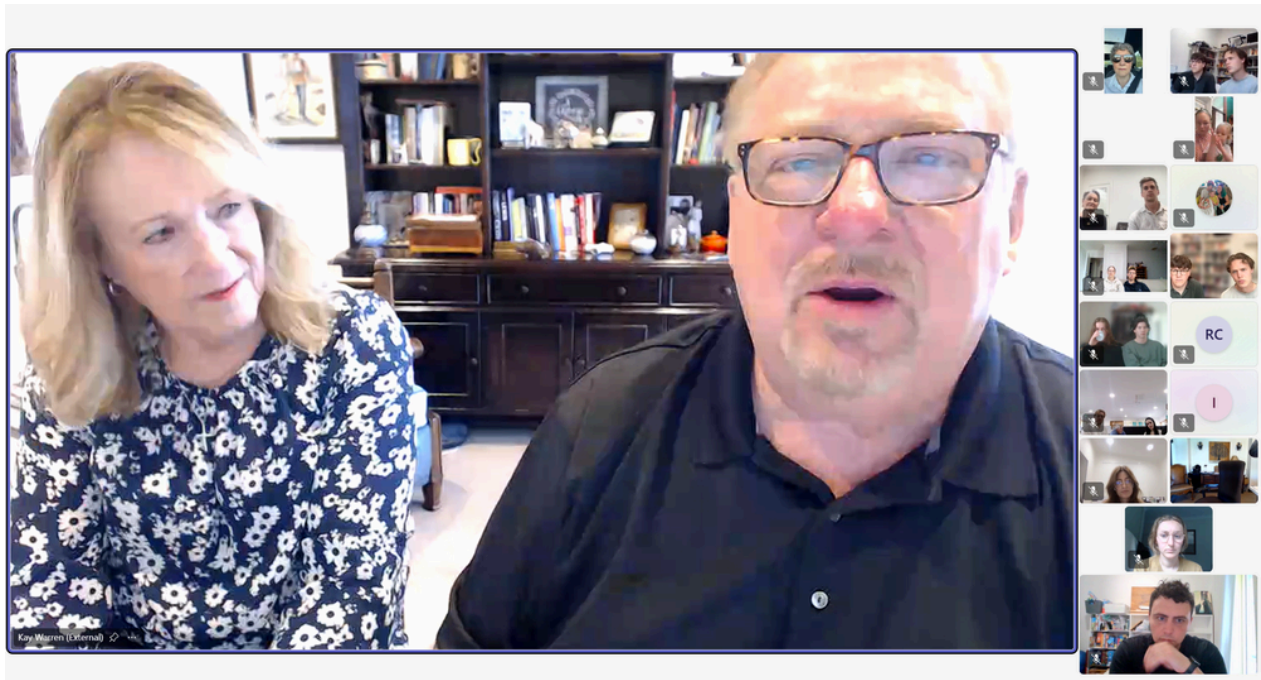
