

# **COUNTRY REPORT**

Radville, Saskatchewan

Jesse Correll recently had the special opportunity to help with seeding at *The Pierce* family farm in Radville, Saskatchewan. Jesse flew to Canada on Easter Sunday this past April. He spent two weeks helping seed a portion of *The Pierce's* 3,700 acres, also known as *Riverview Farm*.

#### Intentional Service

"After working with soup-mix on a daily basis, I wanted to be able to see how the peas and lentils got their start," Jesse said. "On behalf of *Gleanings*, I also wanted to give back to the Pierces who are amazing to come and serve with us and donate some of their crop." *The Pierce* family generously donates a portion of their yearly pulse harvest to the ministry of *Gleanings for the Hungry*.

### **Planting Seeds**

The April weather was brisk and snowy, but Jesse was able to join in with the seeding of canola and durum. This looked like Kent driving the tractor, with a drill attached to

plant seeds, and Jesse driving a grain cart to refill the seed and fertilizer, while another family member was spraying the fields. Jesse really enjoyed this work!

### **Other Farming Tasks**

In addition to planting, he was able to help roll alfalfa, assist with equipment maintenance, change the oil in tractors and trucks, help bring finished canola seed to grain elevators, and perform everyday farming chores.

## **Deeper Connection**

The best part of the experience was being able to get to know the farming community of Radville, Saskatchewan. *The Gleanings* connection with this community continues to deepen. Jesse was able to speak at the nearby Beaubier Pentacostal Church while he was visiting. He thanked the congregation for their participation in the mission of *Gleanings* and encouraged them to come visit.



Jesse's eyes were opened to the experience of the life of a farmer. "It's not easy to be dependent on God's provision for rain and sun. It's a radical way to live," Jesse noted. This is true for our stone fruit farming neighbors in the Central Valley, too. "I now know what it takes for a bag of lentils to be added to the mix at Gleanings." Our prayer is that as more soupmix is made from God's soil, hungry stomachs would be filled, and broken hearts would be healed. We marvel at God's supply chain and continued provision.
