



The closure of thousands of churches in 2024 brought attention to the relationship of the government to religion. This was not persecution so much as the move of the state to exercise regulations upon places of worship. The requirements included matters of safety and hygiene, along with registration, doctrinal statements, and qualifications for pastors. The policy has had both positive and negative impacts, but smaller, poorer, and more rural congregations suffered the most. Pray that every congregation might have a place to gather, and every Christian ample opportunity for fellowship and worship.
