Call to confession Psalm 66:20

Blessed be God, because he has not rejected my prayer or removed his steadfast love from me!

Prayer of confession responsively, followed by a time of silent confession *Congregation, please read bold type.*

Father, I am so deep in the depths of the dark, so pressed down, covered over, long-forgotten, that sun and sky and light and laughter seem like nothing more than a dim dream. But could it be that even here my cries do not fall on deaf ears? That even in this quiet grave, you are–somehow–with me?

If not for your mercy, your gracious forgetfulness, I would have no ground for hope, no expectation of deliverance.

You have proven yourself to be Savior, Deliverer, Lifter of the Weak. I trust that in your good timing I will rise from this death, that the promises you have spoken will come to pass, that this broken earth, scarred by afflictions, will birth life–sevenfold, a hundredfold.

I quiet my soul. I breathe in the Word of your promise. I wait, I trust, that the night will yield to the dawn.

Is this not what you ask of us, Lord? To hope, in spite of unspeakable grief, debilitating sorrow, impenetrable darkness, that somehow, impossibly, this broken world will one day shake free from the bonds of death? That the former things will pass away? *How? When?*




