
A wholehearted thank you to everyone in the church body who is already giving towards the work at St John's.

We hope that all of us who are actively involved, on Sundays or midweek, will prayerfully consider how we can each give financially to support this ministry in which we benefit and serve.


# The need

Excitingly, the congregation at St John's has continued to grow and even with careful financial stewarding, costs have naturally increased. However, giving has not kept pace.




Church growth and giving


# The opportunity

Attendance vs regular givers with capacity benchmarks




## GOSPEL GROWTH WITH THE CHURCH PLANT

There is an extraordinary opportunity for the gospel in Paddock Wood. Over the next 10 years, the population is set to quadruple, with over 20,000 more people expected to arrive in Paddock Wood. This makes it one of the fastest growing areas in the UK.

As the population grows, there will be increased opportunity and need for a new faithful, Bible-believing church in the area.

Furthermore, we are above the practical capacity of St John's and a significant number of congregation members live within the vicinity of Paddock Wood. The gospel opportunity of planting in Paddock Wood is too good to ignore!

# Discipleship


At St John's we are focused on knowing Jesus better and making Jesus better known. To that end we make it our aim to grow in our faithfulness to Jesus. In 2 Corinthians 8:9 we are reminded that we only give out of and in response to God's generous grace to us in Jesus, 'For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you by his poverty might become rich.'

And in Philippians 4:17 we are told what really matters is not how much we give, but the godliness that accompanies such giving, 'Not that I seek the gift, but I seek the fruit that increases to your credit.'


Financial giving is not something we have to do, but something we get to do. Our prayer is that all church members join in joyfully in this key way of partnering in the gospel.

Giving is part and parcel of our discipleship. We praise God for the 155 individuals and households giving at St John's. With an electoral roll of 335, we are some way short of all households contributing. Therefore, we are praying for 100 new households to join in supporting God's work here at St John's through regular giving.

For those in a position to do so, giving 10% can be a helpful starting point. However, we understand financial circumstances vary greatly, and we are grateful for any regular contribution. What matters most is not the amount, but giving cheerfully, generously and sacrificially to the work of the gospel.



Also over the last five years only 39% of givers have increased their giving. We are therefore asking all our existing givers to prayerfully consider increasing their giving by 20%. We recognise some households may not be able to do this, but others may be able to give more.
