Dear Friends of Unity Lutheran Church,

The first four Sundays of this month are titled in order, All Saints Day, the 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday's After Pentecost, and the Last Sunday of the Church Year (also known as Christ the King Sunday). November begins with a remembrance of the faithful departed whom have been called home by the Father. We give thanks for their life and salvation even as we look forward to the reunion with them in heaven. The next two Sunday's scripture readings focus on the end times. The little snippets which God has revealed about that which is to come in this life prior to the triumphant return of Jesus. The final Sunday's title is self-explanatory. This year, there is a fifth Sunday in November. On the 30<sup>th</sup>, we transition our church calendar to begin the year anew. We begin the season of Advent. A season of expectation as we celebrate and remember again the birth of our Savior. It is a time of anticipation. Our church calendar year mimics the Biblical revelation of the end times. The end is not the end for us. It is a new beginning through Jesus.

Until the return of Christ, you and I will face many life endings. Many life failures. We will commit many sins. Some we intentionally commit and others we are unaware of at the time. Through each of these endings, may we cling to the beautiful truth of the Christian life: these endings are not the end. May we see God's big picture of salvation. May we learn to let go of our failures and our sins, leaving them at the foot of the cross. May we repent daily, receive forgiveness daily, and sing God's praises to all who will hear. As we do, may God's peace grow in our hearts and minds.





Over the summer we received a certificate and thank you



Unity Lutheran has agreed again to provide meals for the shelter for the coming season. A shelter meal calendar to cover everyday between November and April was prepared and Unity's Tuesday dates are: December 23, February 17 and April 14.

Can you help prepare a meal? Favorite dinners include: casseroles, meatloaf & mashed potatoes, chicken & rice, macaroni & cheese. A meal usually includes: an entree, vegetable or salad and a dessert. Because of dietary considerations, the shelter asks that there be no meals with pork or fish. Meals for 25 men should be completely cooked and in disposable pans. Dishes can even be prepared ahead of time and arrangements made for delivery.
