Position Overview

First Church of the Nazarene is seeking two motivated and reliable students to serve as Child and Youth Workers for the summer. These roles focus on supporting children's ministry programming, assisting with events, and contributing to a safe, engaging, and Christ-centered environment for children and families.

Key Responsibilities

- Assist in planning, preparing, and delivering children's programs, including summer day camps, special ministry days, and outreach activities
- Help design and implement lessons, organize activity rotations, and prepare materials
- Support volunteer coordination, including onboarding and ensuring safety requirements are met
- Assist with weekend Children's Ministry (classroom support, check-in systems, setup, and supervision)
- Occasionally lead classrooms when required
- Support church-wide events through logistics, setup, and administration
- Maintain ministry spaces, organize supplies, and ensure cleanliness and safety
- Assist with administrative tasks such as scheduling and communication with families
- Support digital tools and systems, including presentation software and website updates
