

Frequently Asked Questions:

Congregational Cards and Gifts

Is a card or gift required?

No. Participation in the processional without a card or gift is still encouraged, a card or gift is entirely optional. Your presence, prayers, and kind words are meaningful ways to show appreciation as well.

What types of gifts are appropriate?

Cards and notes of encouragement are especially welcome. Small personal gifts are also appropriate. Monetary gifts may be given if you feel led to do so.

How can I give a card or gift?

During the service on Sunday, March 29, there will be a brief procession. Ron and Annette will be available for a momentary greeting, and cards may be placed in a basket located nearby. As this processional will be brief, with many people participating, we are happy to share that there will be opportunity to spend more time with Pastors Ron and Annette in the Patio following the service.

Can I give a monetary gift through the church?

No. Monetary gifts should be given **directly to Ron and Annette**. The church will not accept, process, or receipt financial gifts on their behalf.

Can I write a check? If so, how should it be made out?

If you choose to give a check, it should be made payable directly to **Ron and Annette Swor**, not to the church.

Are monetary gifts tax-deductible?

No. Because these gifts are given directly to Ron and Annette and not through the church, they are considered personal gifts and are not tax-deductible.

What if I am unable to attend the service?

If you are unable to attend, you are welcome to send a card or gift directly to Ron and Annette at your discretion.

Why isn't the church handling the funds?

To ensure clarity, transparency, and compliance with church policies, the church is not able to collect or distribute personal monetary gifts on behalf of individuals.
