These questions are designed to help groups discuss this weekend's sermon while building relationships with each other and applying God's Word to our lives.

Week of October 12, 2025

GETTING STARTED

- What is one new thing you have learned about the Holy Spirit so far in the Spirit Filled Life series that has changed you?
- What was something you asked the Holy Spirit to help you on recently?

DIGGING INTO SCRIPTURE

- Acts 1:8 says we will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon us.
 - What do you think that power looks like in daily life? Not just in miracles, but in character, relationships, or decisions?
- The Holy Spirit empowered ordinary people to speak so that everyone could hear the wonders of God in their own language.
 - What might that look like today in our local context or culture?
- Pentecost was both the birthday of the church and a launch into mission.
 - How does that shape how we understand what church is meant to be—gathered and scattered?



HONEST REFLECTION

- The Holy Spirit gives us new life, strength, and conviction. Which of these do you need the most from the Spirit now?
- What does it mean to trust the Holy Spirit, and how is that different from simply believing in Him?
- Where might God be calling you to step into something uncomfortable in order to participate in His mission?
- Do you find it challenging to share your faith with others? If so, what specific difficulties or obstacles do you face when doing so?

PRAYER FOCUS

- Spend a moment confessing to the Holy Spirit your weaknesses and sins, and receive His gentle assurance that you are forgiven and never without help.
- Pray for the Holy Spirit to teach you to recognize His voice and to respond with trust and obedience, even when the path ahead isn't clear.
- Pray for a sensitive heart toward the languages, cultures, and needs of those around you, so that the message of the Gospel may be heard and understood.
- Pray for God to reveal to you different ways to live out the Gospel and opportunities to share your faith in your neighborhoods, workplaces, and city.
