Get Your Ministry Noticed: CUMC Communications

Whether you're planning an event or recruiting for a ministry, communicating the right messages through the right channels can help you raise awareness and increase engagement. If you want to get the word out, contact Communications Beth Crawford, who will work with you on a plan, messaging, and a call to action that fits your ministry's needs. Below are some ways that are typically used to communicate events and ministries.

Weekly Bulletin

Typical bulletin announcements include calendar updates, notices, and worship information. Announcements for larger audiences will be given preference.

Deadline: Tuesday, 5 pm. Typical run is 2-3 weeks.

Midweek News

This email covers timely events and announcements. Most messages cover events/information no more than four weeks out.

Deadline: Tuesday, 5 pm. Typical run is 2-3 weeks.

Newsletter

Covers ministries and missions in a little more depth. Due to space limitations, not all content submitted will be used.

Deadline: Typically the 15th of the previous month.

Verbal Announcements

Cover major events and missions, and are typically delivered by staff. Due to time constraints not all submissions can be included.

Deadline: Wednesday, 5 pm. Typical run is 2-3 weeks.

Indoor Signs and Displays

As with other communication vehicles, please obtain approval before posting signs and displays must be approved prior to posting. This helps maximize readership and minimize clutter.

Facebook, Instagram, and NextDoor

Social media is best used for special events, updates and timely messages. Photos are encouraged (with permission of subjects, particularly minors)

Online Banking. If you're already using your banks' online bill payment platform, it just takes a moment to add Clinton UMC to your list of payees. The process varies slightly by bank, but you will enter Clinton UMC's name and address (PO Box 5331, Clinton NJ 08809) and payment details. Because there's no cost to you or to the church, this is one of our most cost-effective options.

App. With mobile giving, you can give how, when, and where you prefer. Simply click on the "Give" icon and follow the prompts.

Don't have the app? Go to the Apple app store or Google Play store and download the app titled "Church Center." Once you have downloaded this app, it will connect you to a search for Clinton UMC using Clinton's zip code: 08809. You'll only have to do this once.

Thank you to all who donated toys for Project Self Sufficiency's Holiday Hope toy drive for families in need.




Church Season

Christmastide:

The Christmas season immediately follows Advent. The traditional Twelve Days of Christmas begin with Christmas Eve on the evening of December 24 and continue until the feast of Epiphany which is on January 6.

The Time After Epiphany (Ordinary Time)

The first period of Ordinary Time, called the Season after Epiphany, begins on Epiphany Day and ends on February 17, the day before Ash Wednesday (the beginning of Lent). The central theme of this season is the calling of disciples and the early ministry of Jesus. The color for this season is **green**.
