

INTRO DUCTION




For the next 21 days, we are setting our hearts and minds toward one great pursuit: seeking Jesus above all else. As a church, we are asking the Lord to re-order our priorities, renew our affections, and revive our faith as we draw near to Him together.

Throughout Scripture, God invites His people to seek Him—with promise after promise that He will be found, He will answer, and He will transform. Whether you are coming into this season spiritually hungry, weary, distracted, or eager, you are stepping into what God desires for you: deeper communion with Him.

This devotional journey is simple but intentional. Each day focuses on one passage, one theme, and one invitation. You will notice that the question repeated throughout these 21 days is: “How will you seek Jesus today?” That question is not meant to burden you but to anchor you—to remind you that every day holds a fresh opportunity to pursue the One who first pursued us.

My prayer is that these next three weeks will shape us into a church marked not by striving but by seeking; not by anxiety but by abiding; not by self-reliance but by dependence on the Lord, who delights to be found. May we come through this season closer to Jesus, more aware of His presence, and more committed to being a church who seeks God above all else.






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




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
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
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SEEKING JESUS PERSONALLY

DAY 1

Seeking Jesus by Reordering Our Priorities

Matthew 6:33

33 But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.

The context of this passage refers to anxiety around our daily troubles and needs. Our greatest priority is to seek God first, who promises to provide all our needs. In this passage, Jesus tells us how He looks after the birds of the air and the lilies of the field. He then says we are of much more value (v. 26).

Don't let the worries of the day steal your joy and rest in God. He has promised to provide for us. He knows our needs. Our responsibility is to seek Him, His kingdom, and His ways.

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

- Bring your worries and concerns before Him.
- As you go throughout the day, renounce anxiety and revel in gratitude.

DAY 2

Seeking Jesus with a Persistent Pursuit

Matthew 7:7–8, 11

7 “Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you.

8 For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened.”

11 “How much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask him!

What an incredible promise from Jesus. The word ‘will’ is repeated four times. There are no “maybes.” What are you needing this year? What are you trusting for? How much time have you spent with your heavenly Father asking, seeking, and knocking? None of those actions are once-off but denote ongoing perseverance.

Verse 11 says, “how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask Him?” Notice the “good things” are defined by God. We can ask, seek, and knock, but if it is not something “good” as defined by our Heavenly Father, we won’t receive it from Him. He knows best, and so we rest in that!

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

- Bring all your desires and requests before God (ask, seek, knock)
- Ask the Lord to refine your requests and desires to align with what He believes is best for you



DAY 3

Seeking Jesus by Choosing the One Thing That Truly Matters

Luke 10:38-42

38 Now as they went on their way, Jesus entered a village. And a woman named Martha welcomed him into her house.

39 And she had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to his teaching.

40 But Martha was distracted with much serving. And she went up to him and said, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to serve alone? Tell her then to help me."

41 But the Lord answered her, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and troubled about many things,

42 but one thing is necessary. Mary has chosen the good portion, which will not be taken away from her.

Life gets busy, and there is much to do. But there is one thing that is more important than anything else. One thing that will never be taken away from us - seeking and being with Jesus. Martha was doing important things, but not the most important. Meals will come and go; meetings and deadlines will come and go; but investing in our relationship with Jesus will echo on for all eternity.

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

- Do you need to repent of putting other things above your time with Jesus?
- Do you have a devotional plan that will continue after the 21 days of prayer and fasting?
- Do you have a set time and place to sit at the feet of Jesus?



DAY 4

Those Whom God Seeks

John 4:23–24

23 But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father is seeking such people to worship him.

24 God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth.

We don't often think of who God is seeking, but rather who seeks after God. But here Jesus tells us the Father is seeking after those who will worship Him in spirit and in truth. Of course, we live in a world where "truth" is a contentious issue. But thanks be to God for sending His Son to make a way for us to know Him and worship Him. Through faith in Jesus, and what He accomplished on the cross, we can be—and are—regenerated to know the truth and have the gift of the Holy Spirit who helps us worship in the truth.

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

- Seek the Holy Spirit to guide you in your worship and prayers
- Be in the Word of God to sanctify (make holy) your heart

DAY 5

Seeking Satisfaction in Jesus Alone

John 6:35

35 Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me shall not hunger, and whoever believes in me shall never thirst."

Is there a hunger in your soul?

Is there a degree of dissatisfaction deep within you?

Do you long for more in your Christian walk?

Jesus is offering a spiritual meal that will satisfy our deepest longings and hunger. He is offering Himself. He did this first through His sacrificial act on the cross so that we might have that gaping hole within us filled. Now, through faith in Him, we can continually taste of the heavenly life He promised us.

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

- Persevere in your fasting
- Consider an intentional time of prayer in the morning, midday, and evening (a spiritual breakfast, lunch, and supper)



DAY 6

That Nations Would Seek the Lord

Acts 17:26–27

26 And he made from one man every nation of mankind to live on all the face of the earth, having determined allotted periods and the boundaries of their dwelling place, 27 that they should seek God, and perhaps feel their way toward him and find him.

Today spend some time interceding for the nations. Luke records Paul's sermon in Athens outlining one of the purposes of God creating mankind. We are to seek God. In His divine sovereignty God has even allotted "periods" and "boundaries" in order that the nations seek after God.

Too many nations and cultures are blinded by secularism, false religions and atheism. Pray that the Lord would open their spiritual eyes to see Jesus as the One True Lord and Savior of the world.

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

- Pray for Cayman
- Pray for another country, or research the persecuted church or an unreached people group

DAY 7

The Surpassing Worth of Seeking Jesus

Philippians 3:7–8

7 But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. 8 Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord.

Paul had it all going for him. He was the next up-and-coming Pharisee rock star (see Galatians 1:13–14 and Philippians 3:4–6). That was until he encountered the greatest treasure in the world...his Lord and Savior, Jesus.

All the acclaim and respect he would have received from his fellow Judaizers was considered as loss. In accounting terms, his pedigree, performance, reputation, and righteousness moved from the profit column to the loss column when compared to Jesus.

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

- Ask the Lord to search your heart for things you are treasuring above Jesus
- Ask the Lord to continually open your eyes to the awe and wonder of who He is

SEEKING JESUS INTERNALLY

DAY 8

Seeking Jesus Through the Right Mindset

Colossians 3:1-3

1 If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. 2 Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. 3 For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God.

In a world struggling with anxiety, mental fatigue, and distraction through online media, how do we as believers look after our minds? We are to “seek the things that are above.” Paul defines this as the place where Jesus is seated at the right hand of the Father. Therefore, we are to seek the reign and rule of Jesus over our minds and lives.

We are to seek His lordship over our minds. One way we do this is by not setting our minds on earthly things. Whatever occupies our minds occupies our lives and can even determine our lifestyles. But the good news is that since we have been “raised with Christ” and our lives are “hidden with Christ in God,” we are able to set our minds on godly things.

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

- What does it mean that Jesus is at the right hand of the Father?
- Replace social media with Scripture reading



DAY 9

Seeking Jesus through a Faith That Pleases God

Hebrews 11:6

6 And without faith it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him.

In the context of the passage of the heroes of our faith, like Enoch, Noah, and Abraham to name a few, we are told how we too can please God. Faith! Of all the things one might expect like holiness, righteousness, justice, or even love, we are told it is faith. The reason being faith is the vehicle by which we come to know God and are transformed by God. Hence, the writer of Hebrews tells us we are to believe He exists and seek Him. Doing this will bring about a reward.

We are not told exactly what this reward or rewards are, but the fact that it is a promise from our Sovereign Heavenly Father should be enough motivation alone. Many scholars believe it is God Himself—union with God here and now, and future fellowship with Him in glory for all eternity.

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

- Do you believe God exists?
- Seek Him in prayer, silence and solitude



DAY 10

Seeking Jesus by Asking One Thing

Psalm 27:4

One thing have I asked of the Lord, that will I seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the Lord and to inquire in his temple.

If you could ask God one thing, what would it be? Would it be the same as David here in Psalm 27? How many of us would ask for peace from besetting anxiety? Maybe it would be for boldness for a particularly challenging situation? Maybe it would be for freedom from a bad habit or stronghold in your life?

David asked that he “may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of his life” and “to gaze upon the beauty of the Lord and to inquire in his temple.” I think this was a very wise request. I think so much of what we long for from the Lord would be found in His presence. Yesterday, we discovered that this is something the Lord would reward. As we seek Him and inquire of Him, we are blessed with all of who He is to us and for the situations we find ourselves in.

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

- Do we seek the help of the Lord more than the Lord Himself?
- Ask the Lord to reveal more of His beauty and from that flow into inquiry

DAY 11

Desperately Seeking Jesus

Psalm 63:1

*O God, you are my God; earnestly I seek you;
my soul thirsts for you;
my flesh faints for you,
as in a dry and weary land where there is no water.*


Picture yourself stranded on a deserted island or lost out in the desert plains with nothing but sand everywhere, and searing heat beating down on you. In that moment, you want nothing more than fresh water to quench your thirst and save your life. You become fixated with that notion. It is all-consuming.

That's the intensity and the idea the psalmist is trying to convey here. It begins by recognizing who your God is. Our soul's thirst will never be satisfied until it drinks of the God who made it. When the psalmist says, "O God," he is referring to Elohim in the original Hebrew. Elohim was often used in the context of showing God's power and authority. Elohim was used of God in the creation account in Genesis 1. This all-powerful, creator God is the God of souls. Our souls will not find rest and satisfaction until they have found Him. But thanks be to Jesus, we can.

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

- Where are you looking for contentment and satisfaction?
- How can you earnestly seek God today above all else?





DAY 12

Seeking Jesus by Breaking Up Fallow Ground

Hosea 10:12


12 Sow for yourselves righteousness; reap steadfast love; break up your fallow ground, for it is the time to seek the Lord, that he may come and rain righteousness upon you.


By the time these words were spoken through the prophet Hosea, the nation of Israel was not doing well spiritually. Though they were prospering materially, they were compromising their relationship with God. Their hearts had turned toward the false gods of surrounding nations. This verse is a call to stop sowing seeds of unrighteousness and to begin sowing righteousness instead. Notice the promise: if they sowed the righteousness of God, they would reap steadfast love. God calls them to break up the hard and fallow (barren) ground of their hearts—to repent, to turn back, and to seek Him once more. And in response, He promises to graciously rain down righteousness upon them.

The New Testament shows us the ultimate fulfillment of this verse in Jesus Christ, who became our righteousness (Philippians 3:9). Through faith in Him, we receive forgiveness for our unrighteousness and reap the steadfast love of the Lord. And as we walk with Him, the Holy Spirit enables us to live out His righteousness—sowing what pleases God and reaping a harvest of His grace.

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

How will you seek Jesus today?

- Ask Jesus to break up the fallow ground of your heart. In what areas has your heart become dull, distracted or divided?
 - How can you sow righteousness today?
- 



DAY 13

Seeking God in Big Decisions

Luke 6:12–13

12 In these days he went out to the mountain to pray, and all night he continued in prayer to God. 13 And when day came, he called his disciples and chose from them twelve, whom he named apostles...

When it comes to making big decisions, Jesus is an exceptional example. How do you go about choosing twelve men who will be used to change the world? You seek your Heavenly Father, who created the world. On paper, one might have questioned the choices Jesus made: a despised tax collector, a militant zealot set on opposing Roman rule, a bunch of smelly fishermen, not to mention the guy who eventually betrays Him. But as the story of Scripture unfolds, we see how each person was hand-picked to carry out God's plan in one way or another.

When it comes to big decisions we need to make, who are we not to follow the example of our Lord and Savior? Do you have a relationship decision to make? A financial decision, or perhaps a career change? We can easily become distracted by all the information we gather, or the list of pros and cons, or the endless advice we might receive from friends and family members. All good things, but not at the expense of spending more time with your Heavenly Father, who knows all things and controls all things—and most of all, who loves you very much.

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

- Where is your mountain to seek the Lord? Find a quiet and distraction-free place
- Ask the Lord to set you free from self-absorbed motives and give you God-honoring discernment

SEEKING JESUS PRACTICALLY

DAY 14

Seeking Jesus to Spite Anxiety

Philippians 4:4–7

4 Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. 5 Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; 6 do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. 7 And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.


Paul commands us to rejoice and not to be anxious. How can you command someone to stop feeling a certain way so as to feel the opposite way? Simple. Firstly, by understanding the sovereign Lord of the universe “is at hand.” Secondly, reach out to Him through prayer, supplication, and thanksgiving. How do we know the Lord is able to overcome our anxiety?

We are told not to be anxious about “anything” and to pray about “everything.” Paul would only use those all-inclusive words if he knew Jesus was sovereign over “everything” and “nothing” could stop His hand from helping us. Then comes the amazing promise: God’s peace, which defies understanding, “will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.” God’s peace will patrol our minds and hearts, chasing off anxious and irrational thoughts.

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

- Begin with knowing Jesus is at hand and rejoice in that
- Present your requests to God. Try discerning the root cause of your anxiety and pray into seeking the Lord’s peace





DAY 15

Confidence in Seeking Jesus

1 John 5:14–15


14 And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to his will he hears us.

15 And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him.

Confidence is a great feeling. Like playing a game of pickleball knowing you might not be the better player, but you know you have a great strategy. The same is true in our prayer life. We can be confident that our prayers will be effective if we know something. John says, when we know God's will, He will hear us. And if He hears us, then we can know "we have the requests that we have asked of him."

How then can we know God's will? We are to consider two aspects of God's will: His sovereign secret will, known only to Him; and His revealed will found in Scripture. We are to pray according to what is revealed in Scripture, submitting ourselves to God's sovereign will as Jesus did in the Garden of Gethsemane. The more we pray according to God's word, the more our hearts and desires align to the ways and sovereign will of God.

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

- Embrace the fact that God has a sovereign secret will.
 - Renew your mind and heart on the word of God, so that your prayers begin to align with His will.

DAY 16

Seeking Jesus to Be Equipped

2 Timothy 3:16–17

16 All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, 17 that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work.

One of the worst feelings to have is to feel inadequate in life and in the things we do. To counter this, we equip ourselves. We go to university. We upskill ourselves through short courses and conferences. We download apps to make life easier and more streamlined. We use AI.

What would happen if we used a divinely inspired way of equipping ourselves? One way is to use Scripture. Paul says it has been breathed out by God. The writers of Scripture were carried along by the very Spirit of God to pen the very words of God. How does it equip us? It teaches us, reprove, and corrects us, which all corresponds to training in righteousness. It equips us to be righteous in the things we do and the way we are in our various relationships. Ultimately, it results in us becoming complete—meaning more and more competent to meet all demands.

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

- Read Scripture seeking Jesus to teach, reprove, correct and train you in righteousness
- Be obedient to carry out any convictions you may feel

DAY 17

Seeking Jesus Through Spiritual Gifts

1 Peter 4:10–11

10 As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace: 11 whoever speaks, as one who speaks oracles of God; whoever serves, as one who serves by the strength that God supplies—in order that in everything God may be glorified through Jesus Christ.

We seek Jesus and enjoy the presence of Jesus not just through prayer and reading of Scripture but also through serving one another in the gift(s) the Lord has bestowed upon us. We can all do it. Peter says, “as each has received a gift, use it to serve one another.” What if you don’t know what your gift is? Serve as widely as you can, and soon you will begin to see where God’s grace rests over you.

Most importantly is how you serve. We serve according to the grace God gives each one of us. He bestows on each of us a unique amount of favor, ability, and authority to serve His church. We also serve according to the strength He supplies. In this way, God is glorified. God is most glorified when we are most dependent on His grace and strength.

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

- How do you believe Jesus has gifted you?
- Who can you bless with your gifting?



DAY 18

Seeking Jesus Through Serving Our Enemies

Romans 12:19–20

19 Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." 20 To the contrary, "if your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink; for by so doing you will heap burning coals on his head.

This has got to be the most counterintuitive way to deal with an enemy! The world says, deal with your enemy before he or she deals with you. Do whatever it takes to render them powerless to hurt you: Bomb them, unfollow, gossip about them, lie about them, etc. Jesus says, "No, serve them, aid them." Doing this is tantamount to "heaping burning coals" on his or her head. The idea is that acts of kindness will result in the enemy feeling remorse and shame for the way they have treated you. Secondly, and most importantly, it ensures that we are not overcome with evil but rather we overcome evil with good (see verse 21).

But what about the injustice they have caused? God promises to take care of it. He will either pour out His wrath on them. Through their repentance and faith, He has poured it out on Jesus. Either way, God is a God of justice. He sees all the injustices against us and will ensure the appropriate justice is served... including ours. Jesus paid for our injustice not only against others, but also against God Himself. We need to trust this promise lest we step in and make things worse.

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

- Who is causing you great pain and anger?
- How can you serve them?
- Are you willing to allow Jesus to bring justice?



DAY 19

Seeking Jesus by Walking in the Spirit

Galatians 5:16–17

16 But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. 17 For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do.

We have an internal enemy trying to keep us from a deep relationship with Jesus. Paul describes it as our flesh. An internal law (authority) within us that is contrary to the ways of Jesus. In fact, it's all about carnal desires. The flesh wants to seduce the mind into thinking sin is good, stir the affections of the heart to long after it, and so persuade the will to go after it.

But we have a greater power within us. We have God the Holy Spirit, who is on a mission to renew our minds so that we might be able to discern the deception of the flesh. The Spirit is causing our hearts to grow deeper in love with Jesus and so capture our wills to live out our devotion for our Lord and Savior. But we have a part to play too. Paul says we have a responsibility to walk according to the Spirit. We are to be obedient to the guidance and convictions of the Holy Spirit so as not to gratify the desires of the flesh.

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

- Identify the desires of the flesh that seek to trip you up. Know your weaknesses
 - Be sensitive to the promptings of the Spirit.
- Determine to be Spirit-led and Spirit-dependent**

DAY 20

Seeking Jesus Through Wise Use of Time

Ephesians 5:15–17

15 Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, 16 making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. 17 Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is.

In order to fight off laziness, we need to analyze (“look carefully”) how we are generally conducting our lives (“walk”). We can either spend our time wisely or unwisely. The foolish thing to do would be to give in (conform) to the culture or milieu of the day, which Paul describes as “evil”. In contrast, the thing that will ensure we are wise with our time is to seek the will of God.

God’s revealed will for us is found in Scripture. As we pour over His word in dependence on the Spirit, our minds are renewed, and we will be able to discern how to honor God with our time.

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

- How much of your time is spent on foolish things?
- What time of day can you best spend in God’s word seeking His will?



DAY 21

Seeking Jesus When We Are Overwhelmed

1 Peter 5:6–7

6 Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God so that at the proper time he may exalt you, 7 casting all your anxieties on him, because he cares for you.

It might seem unreasonable and even slightly insensitive to say that when we are feeling overwhelmed and anxious, we should humble ourselves. Yet, often when we are feeling apprehensive about something, our thoughts tend to be all about us. We may even begin to believe we are our only hope of getting through it. But if this were true, we could completely prevent ourselves from feeling anxious! We can't! But there is One who can. God has a "mighty hand" that can lift us up from our anxieties. In fact, the very act of casting our anxieties upon Him is to humble ourselves. We are agreeing that we can't do it, but He can.

What assurance do you have that He will help? He cares for you.

HOW WILL YOU SEEK JESUS TODAY?

- Spend some time thanking the Lord for His steadfast love for you
- Spend some time thanking the Lord for His mighty hand that promises to lift you up



