he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.




LAMB OF GOD

The first chalice is wine and the second chalice is grape juice. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request. Those who do not commune may come to the altar for a blessing, indicating so by crossing your arms. As the ministers give the bread and cup to you, they say these words: The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you. **Amen.**






