Care Kits:

- 1 lightweight cotton or cotton blend bath-size towel (20" x 40" to 27" x 52"), dark color recommended
- 2 or 3 bath-size bars of soap equaling 8-9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars
- 1 adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging
- 1 sturdy comb. There are many different types of hair texture so no picks or fine-toothed combs; remove packaging
- 1 metal nail clipper (attached file optional); remove packaging.
