## How to Study the Bible – Learner Guide

### Session 1: Why We Study the Bible

**Scripture Passage:** 2 Timothy 3:16–17

#### Introduction

Many of us own Bibles, but few of us feel confident studying them. This study is for the everyday believer—the mother, the brother, the teenager, the elder—who wants to understand God’s Word for themselves. In this session, we’ll explore why Bible study matters and how it shapes our lives.

The Bible is not a dead book. It’s alive. And it speaks directly to our lives, families, and communities. Scripture gives us direction, correction, and wisdom. You don’t need a seminary degree to study the Bible—you need a willing heart and a desire to grow.

The Bible was not written as one long book—it’s a library of 66 books, written over 1,500 years, in three languages, by many different authors. Yet it tells one unified story of God’s love. Knowing how the Bible is structured helps us understand what we’re reading and why it matters.

## Live It!

This week, commit to 15 minutes of Bible reading daily. Choose one Gospel (like John) and start reading slowly. Ask:

- What does this teach me about God?
  - What is this calling me to do?
