Dear *Church,*

I'm writing this from home, where it is negative three outside and six inches of snow cover the ground and streets. It hasn't been much of a winter until now, at least according to the forecast. But some winters don't show up on weather apps. They show up in tired bones, heavy hearts, and the ache of trying to make sense of a world that feels frayed at the edges.

That's why I've been grateful for our sermon series, *Light in the Long Winter*, which concludes this month. It has helped me practice noticing the light that shows up anyway. Not the dramatic, everything-is-fixed kind of light, but the quieter kind that doesn't erase or deny the darkness but refuses to let it have the last word.

And honestly, that's what Lent feels like to me: a chance to tell the truth about what hurts, what's empty, and what we're hungry for, and find Jesus meets us right there.

On Wednesday, February 18, we will gather for our 6:00 p.m. Ash Wednesday service as we begin our Lenten journey together. Our theme this year is *Bread of Life*. Jesus fed people wherever he went. Sometimes with bread. Sometimes with mercy, forgiveness, stories, and second chances. People didn't leave him perfect. They left him a little more alive. Lent isn't about getting your spiritual act together. It's about making room. Room to notice what we're hungry for. Room to receive what Christ offers. Room to become people who share that life with others.

I hope you'll join us fully in this season. Sign up for our daily devotions. Come to our Wednesday night small group. Worship with us on Sundays. Begin with Ash Wednesday. And save April 2 at 7:00 p.m. for our Maundy Thursday service. You can find more details on page 2. Let's join Jesus at the table, hungry and ready to be fed.

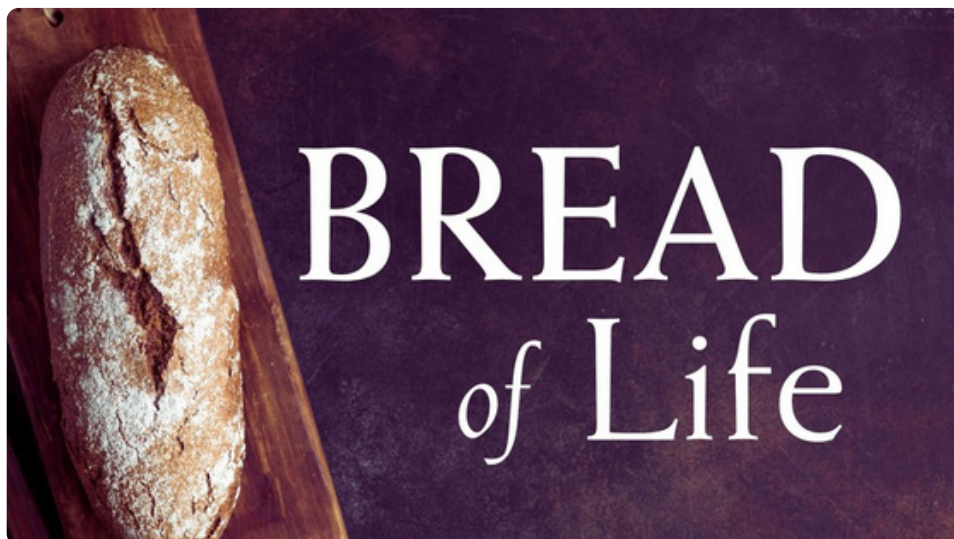

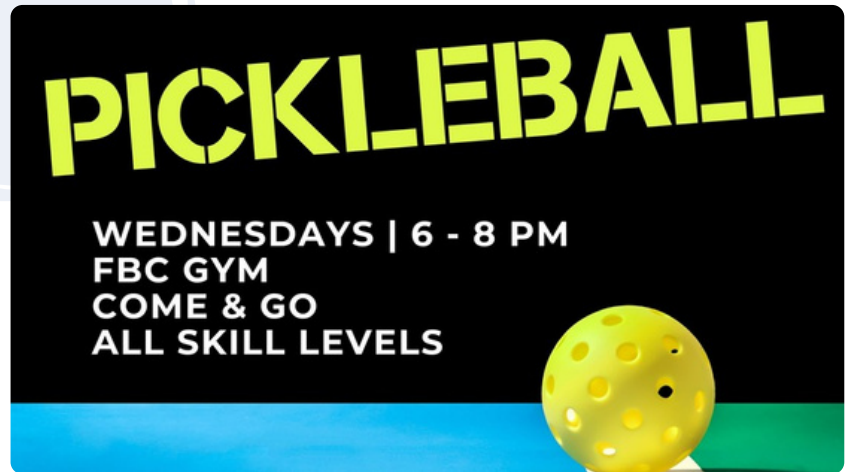

SERVING GENEROUSLY THROUGH LOCAL MISSIONS

Last year, FBC launched an ambitious three-year partnership with two local programs, Transformational Housing and Housing the Community Jefferson City. In addition, FBC regularly provides support to Common Ground through the monthly benevolence donations. Let's take a look at the progress that each of these organizations is making to combat homelessness and housing instability.

Transformational Housing is growing. In addition to the five Cherry St apartments, six units are now ready at 1112 E McCarty. One family has moved in, and the selection process is underway with additional families. Demolition of a dilapidated building at 101 Jackson is complete, making way for new construction to begin in late February. Progress has created a need for personnel. Two job openings have been announced. The Family Support Manager is a part-time position that requires a social work or related degree and experience in case management. The Program Administrator position will be responsible for internal and external communication. It requires proficiency with computers, strong writing, and organizational skills. Interested persons can submit a cover letter and resume to info@transformationalhousing.org. Volunteers will be needed soon for the construction of the new apartment building. Join our Transformational Housing Group in the Church Center App for notices on volunteer opportunities.

Housing the Community of Jefferson City is the "parent organization" for Room at the Inn and Project Homeless Connect. JCRATI completed the first month with an average of just under 20 guests per night (maximum capacity is 20). A policy to accept reservations for the night following a stay has dramatically reduced the early waitlist, and so far, 66 unique guests have been served. Volunteers generously donate time, and approximately \$6,000 of in-kind donations have kept needed supplies on hand. Volunteers are still needed daily for JCRATI. Sign up at fbcjc.org/jcrati. If you would like to shadow Pastor Melissa Hatfield on one of her regular shifts to learn more about JCRATI, contact the church office.

Common Ground receives a large portion of the FBC benevolence offering. The quarterly report provides a snapshot of how contributions benefit community members. Distributions in the 4th quarter of 2025 are as follows: 31 Birth certificates or IDs; 60 bus passes; 15 gasoline vouchers; 7 furniture vouchers; 86 rental assistance; 126 households received utility assistance. FBC provides 2 people each Wednesday to man the front desk. To volunteer or observe, contact Steve Whitlock or Marlene Medin.

During these cold winter months, there is room for 20 adults in the Jefferson City Room at the Inn (JCRATI). Located on the upper level of our gym, JCRATI will operate daily from 5:30 p.m. to 7 a.m. through the first part of March 2026.

First Kids meets on the 2nd floor, Rooms 202 and 203, with Mandee Carney, Jeff Feeler, and Teresa Stull.



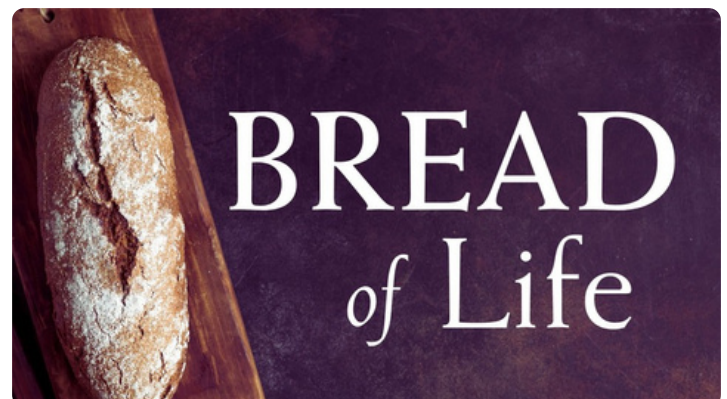
LENT RESOURCE FOR FAMILIES
