One of our core values as a church is to welcome warmly. Hospitality is not just about smiling faces or handshakes—it's also about ensuring people can find their way around. A simple yet powerful way we achieve this is through clear signage that helps both guests and members know where to go.

Over the past year, we've updated our "digital front door" through our new website and church app. Now it's time to ensure that when people arrive on campus, they can find their way easily and feel at home from the very first step. Over the next month, you'll notice new signage appearing both inside and outside our building after months of work with Firehouse Design, a local design company.

Our large (and confusing) complex will be organized into color wings, similar to a large hospital. The Education Building, where preschool and children's programs are held (floors 1–4), will be the Green Wing. The lower parking lot and elevator in this wing will be the Green Lot and Green Elevator, respectively. The green color will be on the signs and accent walls in the stairwell.

The Administrative Building on the east side (floors 3–6, including the church offices) will be referred to as the Blue Wing, featuring the Blue Lot located east of the building and the Blue Elevator. The blue will be on signs and accent walls in the stairwells.

Exterior doors will be clearly numbered. Large parking lot directional signs will be attached to the exteriors of the main building and gym, directing people to the green and blue parking lots. I am deeply grateful to our maintenance team, who have worked tirelessly to prepare our building. Their effort reflects the care and excellence we want to bring to all we do as we welcome warmly in Christ's name.





Each month, a benevolence offering is collected at FBC. 100% of donations remain in the community, and most of it is distributed by Common Ground. The mission of Common Ground is to provide an innovative and relationship-focused approach to addressing the needs of clients in poverty. Through the development of a strong network of community-based partners and services, Common Ground strives to help individuals and families achieve sustainable freedom from poverty.

The ministry began through a collaboration of downtown churches, including FBC JC, to establish fairness and consistency in addressing various requests for assistance. Clients must live within the Jefferson City Public School district, and time limits are in place to determine when and what type of assistance a client may receive. Common Ground employs an executive director, a benevolence coordinator, a benevolence assistant, and a Families Forward coordinator. The reception desk is manned by volunteers from local churches, including FBC JC, on Wednesdays. Each client receives individualized attention and care.

Families Forward is a year-long housing program that provides clients with rental assistance and offers them the opportunity to work closely with advocates to enhance their financial management and life skills. Continued support from the community is essential to the mission of Common Ground.

Benevolence provided by Common Ground during the second quarter of 2025: 60 clients received identification documents to access resources, employment, or housing; 81 received bus passes; 12 received gas vouchers for out-of-town medical appointments; 9 received furniture vouchers for the Habitat ReStore; 41 received rental assistance to prevent eviction; and 90 received utility assistance to prevent disconnection.
