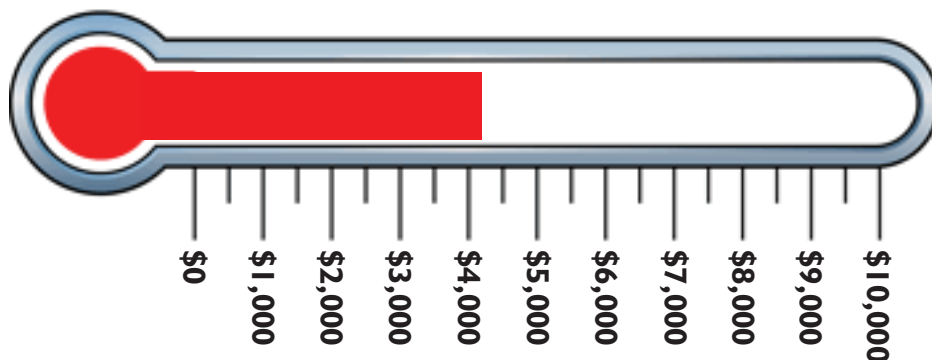

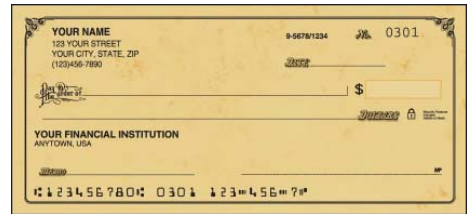

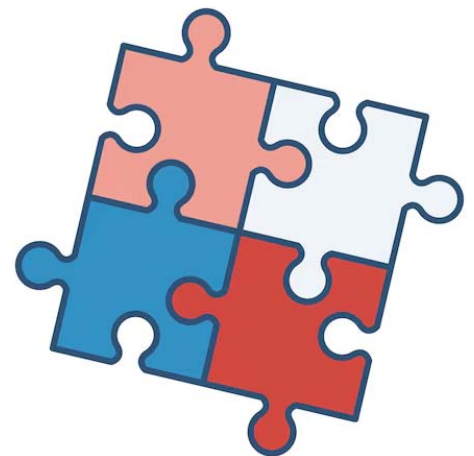

**Shelf stable or canned (any flavor or brand)** • soup • veggies • fruits • meats (spam, tuna, ham etc.) • cereals • Pop Tarts • instant oatmeal • granola bars • juice • pasta

**Needed items grants don't cover** • jellies (any flavor) • pancake syrup • cake mixes/brownies and frostings • sugars (granulated, brown, 10x powdered)

**Misc items not covered by grant funds but are requested all the time** (can be done with a food drive or separately as their own kind of drive) • PAPER PRODUCTS (plates, napkins, toilet paper, tissues, paper towels) • HOME CLEANING SUPPLIES (Pine Sol, etc., dish soap, window cleaner, spray cleaner, bathroom cleaner) • LAUNDRY SUPPLIES (laundry soap, dryer sheets, stain remover) • PERSONAL CARE ITEMS (shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, toothpaste/brushes, bar soap, bath gel, feminine products)

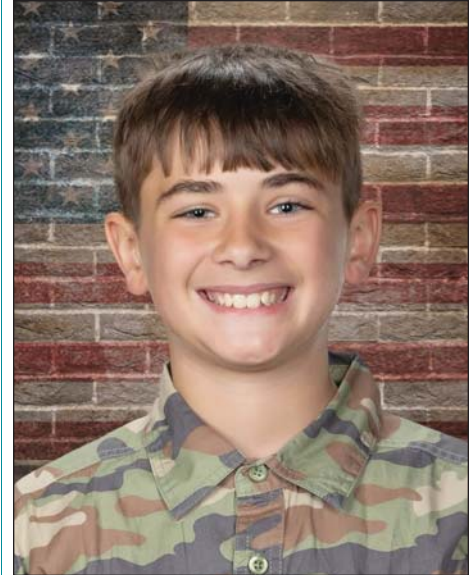

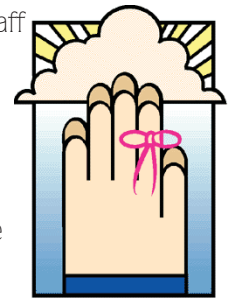
