










Weston Roudebush

One random night, I don't even remember exactly when, I started praying. Hanging on a shelf in my room was The Lord's Prayer, printed on a paper from a Wednesday night Bible school craft from when my family and I lived in our old house. I hadn't really looked at it in a long time, but that night, I prayed those words and it brought me peace. So, I kept doing it. Night after night, it became a habit.

Around that time, I started seeing videos on TikTok, not just trends, but prayers and biblical teachings. One day I put together a prayer of my own and began praying it every night, asking God to help me grow closer to Him. I didn't think much of it at the time, but God heard me, and He took me seriously. During the school year, I was on my phone a lot, and the videos kept coming, especially from this older man named Clif Knechtle. Not long after, I felt the urge to start making TikToks, not silly trends like before, but devotionals. I wanted to share what I was learning. I've always believed in God. I grew up going to church with my grandmother until I was about 11 or 12, but as I got older, I drifted away, and God was no longer the center of my life.

In my early 20s, I started struggling with anxiety and depression. After I had my daughter, it got even worse. I tried medications, but nothing brought real peace.

Then God started pulling me back. I met my husband, his family, and we had our daughter. I built a close relationship with my mother-in-law—anyone who knows her understands why. When we lived with his parents for a while, I'd come upstairs in the mornings and hear K-LOVE playing. God's truth was slowly being planted in my heart again. Then my daughter joined the Awana program, and again, God's Word filled our home.

In late 2018, I began a new job and was overwhelmed with imposter syndrome. I restarted anxiety meds, but I didn't like the way they made me feel. Eventually, I began seeing a counselor, journaling, and in 2022, I asked my doctor to help me come off the medication completely.

At the end of November 2022, my grandmother passed. Then in January 2023, my aunt passed too. I wondered if I had made a mistake coming off the meds, but I turned to prayer and began listening to The Bible in a Year podcast. I didn't expect to understand it all—I just wanted to make God a priority. And the more I listened, the more grounded I felt.

In June 2023, my brother-in-law was put into a medically induced coma. His oxygen level was just 10% when he walked into urgent care. We thought we might lose him—but praise God, he pulled through. Even through the fear, I kept clinging to my time with God. I prayed every morning and every night. I learned through Scripture that so many others have gone through trials like mine. That's when Job became one of my favorite books. His story of faith through suffering gave me hope.

I finished the podcast and started it again in 2024. I still dealt with seasonal depression, but this time I had a stronger foundation.

There's a word that's carried me through everything: faith. My aunt always used to say, "Have faith." I've kept that word close for over a decade. It's on my computer, on a shirt, and even in artwork at home. It reminds me to trust God even when the path isn't clear.

At the end of 2024, a dear friend invited me to do Bible app devotionals with her. That was a major turning point. Diving deeper into Scripture and talking it over with others gave me new understanding and confidence in God's love. She also invited me to attend Cornerstone Church. I had been listening online, but

attending in person made all the difference. I even brought my husband—and he loved it too.

One day this past winter, during one of our regular check-ins, I told my friend, "This is the first winter I haven't had the winter blues." That's because the Bible became my calm, and church became my therapy. I always walk away from Sunday services feeling refreshed and full. I know my aunt and both grandmothers—who loved Jesus so much—are proud of the woman I've become.

I still stumble and fall. But now, when I feel the enemy trying to pull me away from God, I stop and pray. I pray not just for myself, but for my family and friends too.

I see God now in everything. In a sunrise, I thank Him for the light. In the rain, I thank Him for watering the garden and reminding me to rest. When I feel overwhelmed, I thank Him for helping me pause before I react.

I heard someone say recently, "When I say I'm going to pray for someone, I stop and do it right then." That really stuck with me—and I've started doing the same.

I'm getting baptized to declare that Jesus is my Lord and Savior. I want to walk in His light, knowing He's always been by my side—even when I couldn't see it.

n **Sunday**, **August 31**, we'll take communion together to remember Christ's sacrifice on the cross. 

Pop tabs!


he Ronald McDonald house is a home away from home for families with ill children. They provide a place to sleep, a hot meal, and much, support.

A stay for a family is about \$100-\$140 per night. That's \$1,157-\$1,625 a night when the 13-bedroom House is full. Families are only asked for \$10 per night, but not turned away if they cannot contribute that.




