


## Feelin' fine!

## Jump on board!






## Deaf signing


## Ida Marie's BREAKFAST GROUP


## Are you a puzzler?

While any non-perishable food donations are acceptable, we've added a different element to our monthly collections by creating a "Meal of the Month." We offer a meal idea to food bank clients by asking you to take a provided bag each month, fill the bag with the items on the label, and return it to church on the last Sunday of the month. We'll add a recipe card inside so food bank go-ers can have all the items in one convenient location that they can grab, take home, and create a meal!

This month we'll continue our efforts with **7-Can Chili**. Please gather the following items for this month:

- 10.75-oz can of condensed tomato soup
- 15-oz cans of:
  - 1 diced tomatoes (can be chili style, fire roasted, etc.)
  - 1 cannellini or Great Northern beans
  - 1 red kidney beans
  - 2 Hormel (or similar) chili
  - 1 chili beans in mild sauce

**Collect items and return them in the bags provided in the lobby by Food Bank Sunday, March 29.**

Don't forget! We are also collecting ANY non-perishable food item on Food Bank Sunday as well. In February, you included 14 additional items to our bagged meals. A list of most desired items can be found on the Neighbor Helping Neighbors Website. But, this month, we're adding some suggested items that would go well with our meal in a bag! This month, consider donating boxes of cornbread mix, biscuit mixes, and crackers. These items are also due back on the last Sunday of the month and can be placed in the rolling cart in the lobby. As a special request, any donations of sugar-free snacks are welcome!


**Remember, you're always welcome to donate any non-perishable food item with a good expiration date. Thank you for helping us with this Reach project each month!**

## 7-CAN CHILI RECIPE

PREP TIME: 10 min COOKING TIME: 20 min SERVES 6

- |  |   |

| 15-oz. can diced tomatoes (chili-style for zesty spices) | 15-oz. can cannellini or Great Northern beans |
| 15-oz. can red kidney beans                              | 2 15-oz cans Hormel chili                     |
| 15-oz. can chili beans in mild sauce                     | 10.75-oz. can condensed tomato soup           |
| 1 lb. ground beef (optional)                             |   |

If including beef, brown beef in a skillet till cooked through. Break into small pieces. Add beef to a Dutch oven and add all canned ingredients. Add one cup of water. Stir all contents till well combined. Bring to a simmer over medium heat. Cook undisturbed about 10 minutes. Remove from heat. (Optional) Top with items such as cheese, crackers, or sour cream (if desired) and enjoy!

NOTE: Feel free to add a pinch of chili flakes or a dash of hot sauce. Items can also be combined into a crock pot and slow cooked for several hours on low.

**Shelf stable or canned (any flavor or brand)** • soup • veggies • fruits • meats (spam, tuna, ham etc.) • cereals • Pop Tarts • instant oatmeal • granola bars • juice • pasta

**Needed items grants don't cover** • jellies (any flavor) • pancake syrup • cake mixes/brownies and frostings • sugars (granulated, brown, 10x powdered)

**Misc items not covered by grant funds but are requested all of the time** (can be done with a food drive or separately as their own kind of drive) • PAPER PRODUCTS (plates, napkins, toilet paper, tissues, paper towels) • HOME CLEANING SUPPLIES (Pine Sol, etc., dish soap, window cleaner, spray cleaner, bathroom cleaner) • LAUNDRY SUPPLIES (laundry soap, dryer sheets, stain remover) • PERSONAL CARE ITEMS (shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, toothpaste/brushes, bar soap, bath gel, feminine products)




