





# Lending a helping hand to our neighbors

n the **last Sunday of each month**, we collect items for the Neighbors Helping Neighbors Food Bank. Non-perishable food items can be placed in the appropriate bin in the lobby. A list of needed items can be found on the Food Bank's website at nhnfoodbank. com, or select items from the list below. Always needed items include:

Shelf stable or canned (any flavor or brand) • soup • veggies • fruits • meats (spam, tuna, ham etc.) • cereals • Pop Tarts • instant oatmeal • granola bars • juice • pasta

**Needed items grants don't cover** • jellies (any flavor) • pancake syrup • cake mixes/brownies and frostings • sugars (granulated, brown, 10x powdered)

Misc items not covered by grant funds but are requested all of the time (can be done with a food drive or separately as their own kind of drive) • PAPER PROD-UCTS (plates, napkins, toilet paper, tissues, paper towels) • HOME CLEANING SUPPLIES (Pine Sol, etc., dish soap. window cleaner, spray cleaner, bathroom cleaner) • LAUN-DRY SUPPLIES (laundry soap, dryer sheets, stain remover • PERSONAL CARE ITEMS (shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, toothpaste/brushes, bar soap, bath gel, feminine products)



onsider donating your empty egg cartons to the NHN Food Bank! They use them every day in their store and are always in need! Drop them off in the church kitchen. Plastic grocery bags are no longer needed.

### Save your bags

f you get paper bags with handles from grocery delivery (like Giant or similar), we'd love to take them off your hands! We use these bags for our Thanksgiving Outreach, Santa's Workshop, and more. Bags can be dropped off at the church office anytime.



We are also collecting new or used (no holes and handles

attached) XL reusable shopping/tote bags. These are incredibly beneficial when delivering larger orders for our Thanksgiving Meal and we pack our Adopt-a-Family gifts in these bags. Average size is 20" x 8" x 18."



# Pop tabs!

he Ronald McDonald house is a home away from home for families with ill children. They provide a place to sleep, a hot meal, and much, support.

If you drink anything from a can with a tab, you can effortlessly help contribute to the Ronald McDonald House! They ask for tabs as a donation. They turn those into money. 1,128 tabs = 1 pound. On average, they receive 40 to 50 cents per pound.

A stay for a family is about \$100–\$140 per night. That's \$1,157–\$1,625 a night when the 13-bedroom House is full. Families are only asked for \$10 per night, but not turned away if they cannot contribute that.


