

SEARCH ANNOUNCEMENT

fter many hours of prayer and discussion, and sifting through many résumés, the Pastor Search Team has selected **Eddie Owens** as the candidate for our lead pastor.

After Pastor Dave announced the Sherwoods' decision to move on to the next part of their faith journey, the Elders formed a Pastor Search Team to find Cornerstone's next pastor—one that God was already preparing for our church. In the past few months, God was stirring up something exciting in the staff members and Elders. They all felt that God had something big planned for Cornerstone.

The team received a significant number of applications, and it was time-consuming to filter through them and narrow it down to the top candidates. Over the last few months, the team reviewed résumés, listened to sermon samples, and used other resources to find qualified applicants who agreed with the mission and vision of Cornerstone. Team members prayed for God's discernment and direction, and God delivered. One applicant rose to the front—Eddie Owens. According to the team, Eddie aligned with Cornerstone, and we aligned with how Eddie was wired. Eddie doesn't feel that being our pastor is a job—it's a calling. The Pastor Search Team, together with the staff and Elders, unanimously agreed that Eddie Owens was the man God was preparing for Cornerstone.

Eddie was a guest speaker on October 26, and he will be back with us on Sunday, December 7. Be sure and take this opportunity hear Eddie preach again, and chat with him

after both services and ask questions. On **December 14**, at a meeting following the second service, we will be asking all partners to affirm **Eddie Owens as lead pastor at Cornerstone**.

We encourage everyone in the Cornerstone family to attend this meeting, and join with the Search Team and Elders in prayer for Cornerstone's future.

People often miss the weight of what Jesus was saying in the Prodigal Son story.

It was told against the backdrop of ancient Jewish customs. If you disgraced your family or wasted your inheritance among outsiders, the village would meet you at the border, smash a clay pot at your feet, and declare you cut off. The shattered pieces said Your relationship was broken. You were finished. No coming back. It wasn't dignified. It was cold and final.

This was the ceremony of kezazah. Your people publicly declared you "cut off."

That's the long, lonely walk the prodigal was taking. Dirty. Empty. Rehearsing a speech he knew wouldn't fix anything.

Bracing himself for judgment, he knew he deserved. But Jesus ...

He says the father saw the boy while he was still far away ... and ran. He ran! Love ran.

In this culture. Older men didn't run. It wasn't dignified. It required the lifting of the robes and exposing the ankles. Immodest.

But this father wasn't worried about dignity.

He likely wasn't racing because of sentiment alone.

He was racing to get there before anyone else could.

Before a pot could shatter.

Before the village could declare the boy cut off.
Before justice could step in with its list of accusations.

Before kezazah.

He ran to intercede. To throw his arms around a son who thought he'd burned every bridge.

To make it clear that mercy would speak first.

And mercy would speak louder than kezazah.

Jesus is the Father who moves toward you faster than your failures move against you.

When you finally come to yourself ...

When you turn around and start the long walk back ...

You may expect harsh words.

You may rehearse your apology.

But the Father cuts you off ...

You are not a servant trying to earn your way home.

You are a son or daughter being restored.

Robe. Ring. Shoes.

Full welcome. Full belonging.

No shame. Only transformation.

The Body of Christ Needs You

"All of you together are the one body of Christ, and each one of you is a separate and necessary part of it."

1 Corinthians 12:27 (TLB)

God made the church, His family, so that we need each other to fulfill His purpose for us on earth. We are all made for a mission, and He wants us to do that mission together.

One of the most important reasons you need to be connected to a church family is to fulfill your calling to serve other believers in practical ways. The Bible says, "All of you together are the one body of Christ, and each one of you is a separate and necessary part of it" (1 Corinthians 12:27 TLB).

Your service is essential to the body of Christ. Each of us has a role to play, and every role is important. There is no small service to God. It all matters!

No ministry in the church is insignificant. Some are visible, while some are hidden and work behind the scenes, but all are valuable—and the small or hidden ministries often make the biggest difference. In my home, the most important light is not the large chandelier in our dining room but the little night-light that keeps me from stubbing my toe when I get up at night.

There is no correlation between size and significance. Every ministry matters because we're all dependent on each other to function.

When one part of your body fails to function, you get sick. The rest of your body suffers. Imagine if your liver decided to start living for itself: "I'm tired! I don't want to serve your body anymore! I want a year off just to be fed. I've got to do what's best for me! Let some other part take over."

What would happen? Your body would die.

Today thousands of local churches are dying because of Christians who are unwilling to serve. They sit on the sidelines as spectators, and the body of Christ suffers.

God calls you to a service far beyond anything you could ever imagine. He created you for a life of service: "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Ephesians 2:10 NIV). Whenever you serve others, you are actually serving God.

Don't be content any longer with just letting others do the work of the church. It's time to do your part!

Two things that could measure who we are: The way we manage when we have nothing and the way we behave when we have everything.
