A new year, a new beginning at Cornerstone

Thank you so much for the opportunity to share my story and heart with the Cornerstone family. It's a blessing to begin connecting with everyone, and I hope these responses help our church get to know me a little better.

Grateful for the journey, excited for the future

As I look back on the journey that has brought me to Cornerstone, my overwhelming response is not pride or confidence, but gratitude. I am deeply aware that I am undeserving of God's grace yet continually blessed by His faithfulness. Every step, every season, and every redirection has been guided by the Lord's hand, and I am truly thankful for His calling and for the privilege of serving His Church. It is only by God's grace that I am here, and it is with a humble and grateful heart that I step into this next chapter with the Cornerstone family.

Spiritual journey/testimony

Before I share more about my heart for ministry and our future together as a church family, I think it's important for you to know my story; not because it's extraordinary, but because it highlights the extraordinary grace of God. Every pastor is first and foremost a testimony of what Christ can do, and mine is simply a reminder that God often begins His work in our lives long before we recognize it.

I did not grow up in a Christian home, but I am deeply thankful for the parents God gave me. They taught me the value of hard work, integrity, and dedication from an early age—lessons that shaped my character long before I understood the Gospel. After high school, I joined the United States Marine Corps, a decision that would significantly influence both my life and my faith journey.

While serving in the Marines, I met my wife, Lisa, who was also on active duty at the time. After several attempts to take her out, she finally agreed, and her invitation came with a condition: church. Wanting to spend time with her,



I went along. It didn't take long for me to know she was "the one," and I eventually asked her to marry me. Lisa lovingly but clearly told me that before she could even consider marriage, my relationship with Christ mattered deeply. Trying to win over Lisa, I went forward at the church we were attending at the time, spoke with the pastor, and prayed a prayer. Looking back, I realize now that I had not truly surrendered my heart to Christ. There wasn't genuine repentance yet, and my life continued to reflect someone living for himself. I had told Lisa I got saved, but I was a fraud.

Lisa and I were later married, and we were stationed in Okinawa, Japan. Lisa began faithfully attending church. I, on the other hand, continued to reserve Sundays for football and sleeping in. Week after week, Lisa graciously invited me to attend church with her, and most weeks I declined. Eventually, after enough Sundays alone, and perhaps after running out of good excuses, I finally went with her. I went that morning with a critical spirit, fully intending to pick apart the preaching and quietly judge the people. But God had other plans. Those seeds planted and watered were about to take root. During that service, the Holy Spirit convicted my heart, clearly showing me my sin and my need for a Savior. For the first time, I truly understood the Gospel; not just with my mind, but with my heart. That day, I placed my faith fully in Jesus Christ alone for salvation. God did what only He can do—He changed me

from the inside out. I was later scripturally baptized at the age of 20, marking the beginning of a genuine walk with Christ. Looking back now, I see God's patience, grace, and perfect timing in every step of the journey. My testimony is not about a perfect path; it is about a faithful Savior who pursued me even when I wasn't seeking Him.

It is with that same humility and gratitude that I now serve as pastor here at Cornerstone, deeply thankful for God's grace in my life and honored to walk this journey of faith together with you.

On the lighter side

Let's move to some of the lighter—but still very important—answers to some questions. I am, without apology, an apple pie guy. That said ... a good marble cake with buttercream or cream cheese frosting is hard to beat. So, let's call it a gracious tie and move forward in unity. I proudly cheer for the Philadelphia Eagles (even in the difficult seasons; we call that spiritual growth). I should also confess that I'm an Alabama football fan, so getting to watch Jalen Hurts play every week makes being an Eagles fan far more fun.

I run on coffee, prefer Coke over Pepsi, love summer and fall, and Christmas wins by a landslide. If it involves lights, music, and celebrating the birth of our Savior, I'm all in. I'm a beach guy, a Ford guy, and when it comes to sports, give me football and hockey. I love dogs, pizza, the color blue, and all genres of music, though CCM is obviously at the top of the list. My go-to movie series is *Mission: Impossible* (I admire the optimism of someone who keeps saving the world with about 30 seconds left). My favorite book is the Bible, and my favorite book of the Bible is James—direct, practical, and impossible to ignore.

I enjoy running, working out, reading, being outdoors, and spending time with my family. We have two dogs: Bella, a beautiful German Shepherd, and Graham, our female Stitch-alien look-alike mutt who fully believes she's in charge of the house. She is not; but we love her anyway. And if you're wondering about a dream vacation, it's Greece, one of the most beautiful places in the world. And the food? Forget about it. Walking where Paul walked, opening the Scriptures, and sharing a meal that reminds you to slow down and thank God; it's hard to beat.

My journey to ministry didn't begin in a pulpit; it began in the United States Marine Corps, where I served for more than two decades. That season shaped my discipline, leadership, and work ethic, but more importantly, God used it to teach me about service, sacrifice, and obedience. Over time, the Lord made it clear that while I loved serving my country, He was calling me to shepherd His people. The transition into pastoral ministry was not sudden, it was

prayerful, affirmed, and clearly led by God.

Along the way, I've witnessed God's faithfulness through mission trips to places like the Philippines and Poland, moments of joy and sorrow, closed doors that later proved to be protection, and seasons of waiting that strengthened my trust in Him. Many things I once saw as setbacks became blessings in hindsight. 2 Corinthians 12:9 "But he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses."

Why Cornerstone?

What drew me to Cornerstone was a shared love for Jesus, a commitment to God's Word, and a genuine desire to keep growing together. I sensed humility, unity, Christ-centered passion, and faithfulness; and that is a church worth serving with your life.


I'm excited about what God is already doing at Cornerstone, and my heart is simply to build on that strong foundation. As we move forward together,

I'd love for us to continue growing in discipleship, helping people not just attend church, but partner with the church and truly walk with Jesus day by day. I'm also passionate about strengthening community and connection, making sure no one feels invisible, and that we're caring well for one another. And finally, I believe God has more opportunities ahead for us to be outward-focused, loving our neighbors, serving our community, the ends of the earth, and sharing the hope of Christ beyond our walls.

"God moments"

Having deployed multiple times with the Marine Corps, I came face to face with the brevity of life in a way I never had before. Those experiences deeply shaped me. In moments where tomorrow was never guaranteed, God stirred my heart with a growing urgency for the Gospel. I became consumed, not in a dramatic way, but in a steady, lifelong way—with sharing Christ, preaching the Word, and helping people grow in their knowledge of Scripture and in their walk with Jesus. Those seasons clarified what truly matters and continues to drive my passion for ministry today.

The Marine Corps taught me discipline, leadership, and service, but over time God made it clear that my calling was shifting. I realized that while I loved leading Marines, my deepest joy came from shepherding people spiritually—walking with them through life, pointing them to Christ, and opening God's Word together. The transition wasn't sudden or rushed; it was prayerful, affirmed by others, and clearly directed by the Lord. God didn't waste my time in the Marines; He used it to prepare me for ministry. Planting and watering ...



Benevolence is incredibly important to me because it reflects the heart of Jesus. It's the gospel in action: meeting real needs while pointing people to real hope. I believe the church should be a place where people feel loved, supported, and cared for, especially in hard seasons. When we help someone in need, we're not just helping—we're offering dignity, compassion, and the love of Christ.

My influences

Several people stand out. First, my dad, who modeled hard work, integrity, and perseverance—lessons that shaped me long before I understood faith. Second, my wife, Lisa, whose faith, patience, and unwavering love have been one of God's greatest gifts in my life. And third, I would also add my daughters, who have influenced me in ways they probably don't even realize. Being their father has taught me a greater love, sacrifice, humility, patience, and dependence on the Lord. They've reminded me daily that leadership begins at home and that faith is most powerful when it is lived out consistently and authentically. Finally, Pastor Nut, my spiritual dad in words. He was incredibly patient and kind with me, especially during my early years of faith. The grace and love he poured into me and into our marriage profoundly changed me as a man, a husband, and a follower of Christ.


Santa's Workshop Update: We had 80+ children shopping and 45 volunteers on Saturday, December 6.


Chair stacking party




Thursday women's Bible study

With the start of 2026, we'll be restarting our Food Bank Sundays! The last Sunday of the month we ask you to bring in non-perishable food items for donation to the Neighbor Helping Neighbor Food Bank. January donations will be due **Sunday, January 25.**

A meal all ready to prepare

While any non-perishable food donations are acceptable, we are going to be adding a new element to our monthly collections by creating a **"Meal of the Month."** According to David Counsil, Executive Director of Neighbor Helping Neighbor Food Bank, "I hear people say that they are not sure what to do with certain items or how to prepare the items." So we thought Cornerstone could help meet that need. We're going to be offering a meal idea to food bank clients by asking you to take a provided bag each month, fill the bag with the items on the label, and return it to church on the last Sunday of the month. When you return the bag at the end of the month, we'll put a recipe card inside so food bank go-ers can have all the items in one convenient location that they can grab, take home, and create a meal! If you prefer to just buy the items and return them to church, that's fine, too. At the end of the month volunteers will assemble bags from the products you bring back.

This month's **"Meal of the Month"** is Chicken Cobbler. Please target the following items when shopping this month:






