## WEEKLY MEMORY VERSES

### FEBRUARY 2 - FEBRUARY 6 | EPHESIANS 3:20-21

"<sup>20</sup>Now to him who is able to do above and beyond all that we ask or think according to the power that works in us — <sup>21</sup>to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen."

### FEBRUARY 9-13 | HEBREWS 11:24-26
