Week 7

WEEK 7 - Thyatira

Monday

Read: Revelation 2:18

Jesus presents Himself to Thyatira as “the Son of God, whose eyes are like flames of fire and whose feet are like burnished bronze.” This is the only place in Revelation He uses “Son of God.” Thyatira was a working trade town known for its guilds (Acts 16:14). Participation often involved pagan feasts and practices, pressuring believers to compromise. Jesus asserts His unique authority over all powers and idols.

What stands out to you about these scriptures?

How has Jesus revealed himself to you in different ways in your life? Do you ever miss His voice because He’s speaking in a new way?

Prayer: Lord Jesus, thank You for showing me who You are every day. Please help me to be receptive to what You are trying to tell me. Amen.



This week in your Discipleship Group, discuss the different ways Jesus can speak to us and how we can stay attentive to His voice.

Tuesday

Read: Revelation 2:19

Jesus commends Thyatira’s works, love, faith, service, and patient endurance—and notes their later works exceed the first. Growth pleases Him. In a culture pulling them toward compromise, Jesus sees their progress.

What stands out to you about this scripture?

What are we fighting against in our modern world, both as a church and as individuals? Where have we been successful, and where do we need strengthening?

Prayer: Lord Jesus, thank You for seeing the world we live in, and understanding what we are fighting against. Please help me to celebrate the small wins, as You do. Amen.

Wednesday

Read: Revelation 2:20–21; James 4:4

The rebuke: Thyatira tolerates a false teacher (“Jezebel”) who leads into sexual immorality and eating food sacrificed to idols. Jesus gave time to repent, but she refuses. Likewise today, pressure to blend in is real. Friendship with the world’s value-system is enmity with God. Jesus calls His church to truth without compromise.

What stands out to you about these scriptures?

Are there areas where you are trying to have the best of both worlds, but losing both in the process? What behaviours is God asking you to change?

Prayer: Lord Jesus, thank You for Your example of how to live. Thank You that You see how hard it is to live in the world now, and You want to help me be better. Show me if there’s any area of my life where I’ve been compromising. Be honest with me in a way I haven’t been to myself. Amen.

Thursday

Read: Revelation 2:22

Jesus warns of discipline for unrepentant sin. God never brings shame or condemnation, but always calls us back. Being in church doesn't make us immune; we remain responsible for our responses to cultural pressure. His warnings are His grace to us, they are invitations to return.

What do these scriptures reveal about Jesus?

Ask Holy Spirit to reveal if there's anything in your life that you need to repent of.

Prayer: Dear Jesus, I'm so grateful You understand that I live in a broken world, and am going to make mistakes. I am sorry for where I've fallen, whether by accident or on purpose. I repent, I turn from my old ways and I ask for Your forgiveness so that I can strengthen my relationship with You. Amen.

Friday

Read: Revelation 2:23–25

Jesus is the One who searches mind and heart and will repay according to deeds (Rev 2:23). Choices carry consequences. To the faithful He says, "Hold fast what you have until I come." Today's encouragement is to keep clinging to Christ until He returns. Our hope is life with Him forever in His new creation (Rev 21–22).

What stands out to you about these scriptures?

Consider a time in your life where you experienced the natural consequences of your actions. How did it change your behaviour? How might you act if you lived with these eternal outcomes in mind?

Prayer: Lord Jesus, thank You that all You want is relationship with me. Help me to choose you every day, holding tightly to the truth I know and not allowing it to be compromised with how others live. Amen.

Saturday

Read: Revelation 2:26–28; Psalm 2:8–9; Revelation 22:16; 2 Peter 1:19

To the one who conquers and keeps Christ's works to the end, Jesus promises authority over the nations (echoing Psalm 2) and "the morning star." Jesus Himself is the bright Morning Star (Rev 22:16); receiving Him is the ultimate reward. As His light dawns in our hearts (2 Pet 1:19), we live from a new identity and future.

What stands out to you about these scriptures?

How does sharing Christ's authority and knowing He is the Morning Star shape our ability to persevere today?

Prayer: God, thank You that no matter what anyone else has spoken over me, it's your words that matter most. Holy Spirit, I pray that you will wash my mind with your truth. I thank you that I live in victory as long as I remain in you. Help me see myself the way You see me, and live in the authority I have in Christ, in Jesus' name. Amen.
