From Pastor Mark

As we enter May I am reminded of an ancient Saint who is a prominent example of faith and persistent prayer. She is none other than the mother of the Early Church Father, St. Augustine of Hippo, North Africa. Her name was Monica and she lived in the fourth century (331–387 AD). May 4th is her day. She, like many Christian parents, spent a lot of her time thinking about her wayward son. He was worldly, and sought out the pleasures and accolades of the world. He was successful in academics. You can read his “Confessions” at CCEL.org (Christian Classics Ethereal Library). He ventured into spiritual things, but not Christianity. He did not convert to Christianity, coming to faith in Christ, until he was 31 or 32 years old. He was teaching rhetoric in Milan and was heavily influenced by Bishop Ambrose. Ambrose was his spiritual father and showed him the love of Christ. He was baptized by Ambrose when he was 33 years old.

All this time Monica was praying for her son - like many Christian parents and grandparents pray for their families who have children not baptized and those who have no time for or interest in the Christian faith. That is until a crisis comes. Hopefully, awareness of Christ, his love, his forgiveness, and faith comes before it is too late for them. So, we, like Monica, persist in prayer, asking God the Holy Spirit to work on our loved ones and draw them by the gospel to know and believe in Christ as their Savior. Monica did not give up on her wayward child, Augustine.

In his Table Talks, Luther’s Works, Vol. 54 (American Edition), Luther references Monica and how God answered her prayers. Monica is not someone we pray to. However, she provides a great example of not giving up. She is someone who’s life tells us not to despair, but to keep praying for God’s grace to be given to our children and grandchildren. Gentle conversation is important to share the love of Christ with our families.

When Monica died in 387 A.D., she was at peace with her son. It was right after his conversion to faith in Christ and his baptism. Augustine writes in his Confessions about the gentle conversation between mother and son about eternal life.

Remember that God loves your family and encourages you to continue praying for those who have wandered from faith, or those who have yet to experience the love and mercy of Christ.

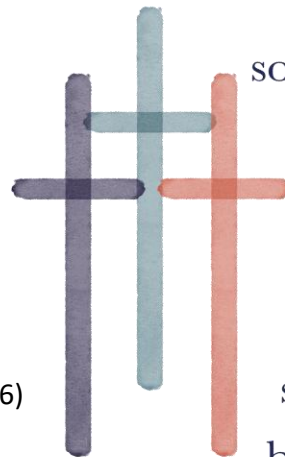
Presidents Report

In my former life as a Lutheran school teacher, I tried a classroom philosophy that was based on lessons learned in my undergrad education classes at Concordia Teachers' College, Seward, Nebraska. My sainted, secondary ed instructor drilled into all of us would-be "teachers of the year" to simply KISS - Keep It Simple, Stupid. It was the only way, according to his ed methods, that young, impressionable, short attention span minds could absorb the complex concepts and intricate workings of the universe. So, I tried that approach as a young teacher. As it turns out, that got me just past page 1 of the introduction to the textbook – because algebra quickly disintegrated into word problems and quadratic equations. Biology quickly disintegrated into microscopic cellular components and the chemistry of photosynthesis. Later on in life, I attempted to apply that philosophy to medicine. But -- the patient's, "I'm not feeling very well," quickly dissolved into elevated liver functions and complex electrolyte abnormalities. The simple handling of the lowly sugar molecule became a complex dance of diet, medications, lab tests, encouragement/cajoling of the ever-changing world of the diabetic.

Experience showed me that if you want to really "simplify" life then it all boils down to "pre-columbarium" and "post-columbarium." The "pre-columbarium" part is not simple, is joyful, is painful, may be short or may be long and is filled with continual challenges, adjustments and opportunities. The "post-columbarium" part is gifted, eternal, peaceful and God-filled.

So, there are really two KISS's that we are blessed with – both from God: "I came that you might have life, and that you might have it more abundantly" (John 10:10) – pre-columbarium era. "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life" (John 3:16) – post-columbarium eternity. So, whether you are a teacher or a doctor, a butcher, a baker or a candlestick maker, these are the only KISS's that really matter!

One Hour Documentary on the History of the English Bible.

Pastor Vern has made arrangements to show this movie as part of his "Survey of the Bible" class. "The Forbidden Book" is unlike anything you have ever seen before. It is hosted by **Dr. Craig Lampe** of the **Litchfield Park Bible Museum**. This one-hour documentary takes you on a fascinating journey through time. Follow the film crew across Europe as they show you all the important places of Christian history connected with translating the Bible into English.

Learn how God's Word was originally scribed in Hebrew and Greek. Walk with Dr. Lampe among the ruins of the very first Christian Church ever built above ground... not in Israel, but in England! Discover how the Word of God was preserved through the 1,000-year period of the Dark and Middle Ages, when possession of scripture in any language other than Latin meant certain death at the hands of the organized church. Uncover the truth about the misunderstood books called "Apocrypha" that were printed in every Protestant Christian's Bible until 1885.

Meet John Wycliffe, the first person to translate the Bible into English. Look at the door where Martin Luther nailed his 95. Find out why William Tyndale was executed for being the first person to print the scriptures in English. Find out King Henry the Eighth's 1539 "Great Bible" ...the first legal English Bible. "The Forbidden Book" is simply the most captivating and informative video ever produced on the subject of how we got the Bible, and how God has preserved His Word for thousands of years to countless generations.

Giving the Comfort We Ourselves Have Received

During this season of the Church Year, we walk a sacred and hope-filled path, from the joy of the Resurrection, to the promise of the Ascension, to the power of Pentecost, and into the life of Christ’s Church.

After His resurrection, our Lord Jesus spent forty days with His disciples, comforting, strengthening, and preparing them. He knew the grief, fear, and uncertainty they carried. Yet He did not leave them there. He gently led them forward, anchoring them in His promises and preparing them for what was to come.

This same pattern is one we experience in GriefCare. When we first come together, our grief can feel overwhelming, heavy, disorienting, and deeply personal. Yet, as we draw close to God’s Word and walk alongside one another, something begins to change. The Lord meets us in our sorrow. He comforts us, not only through His promises, but through His people.

As Scripture reminds us:

“Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our affliction...” (2 Corinthians 1:3–4).

Little by little, as the Lord brings healing, He also begins to reshape our grief into compassion. The comfort we receive becomes a gift we can share with others. This is the work of the Holy Spirit. Before His Ascension, Jesus promised His disciples that they would not be alone, *“...you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit...”* (Acts 1:5).

At Pentecost, that promise was fulfilled. The Spirit was poured out, and ordinary people were equipped to carry out Christ’s mission in the world. That mission continues today, through His Church.

The Lord lifts our eyes beyond our present sorrow to a living hope, *“...that you may know what is the hope to which He has called you...”* (Ephesians 1:18). The Lord surrounds us with His Church, brothers and sisters in Christ who walk beside us, reflect His love, and remind us of His promises.

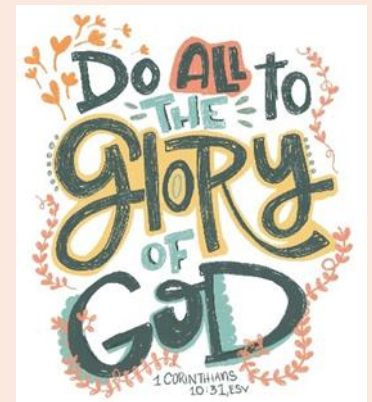

MEET EVERGREEN LUTHERAN SCHOOL, Detroit, MI

Evergreen Lutheran School is a “small but mighty” ministry in Detroit MI...the only Lutheran School in Detroit. It serves K-8th grades in a one-room classroom. Rev. William Danowski is both the full-time Pastor of the church and the full-time Lead Teacher of the school. The church, with 50 baptized members and an average attendance of 20 worshippers on Sunday, supports the school with a volunteer video teacher and many volunteers serving as teacher aides and lunch prep/servers. The church also rents space to a private Christian preschool with whom they cooperate and who helps pay the bills, because the school does not charge tuition.

Evergreen School is helped financially by the state of Michigan with only \$400 per year, and the Lutheran District office supports with \$600 per year. COL's financial help, through your support, is greatly appreciated.

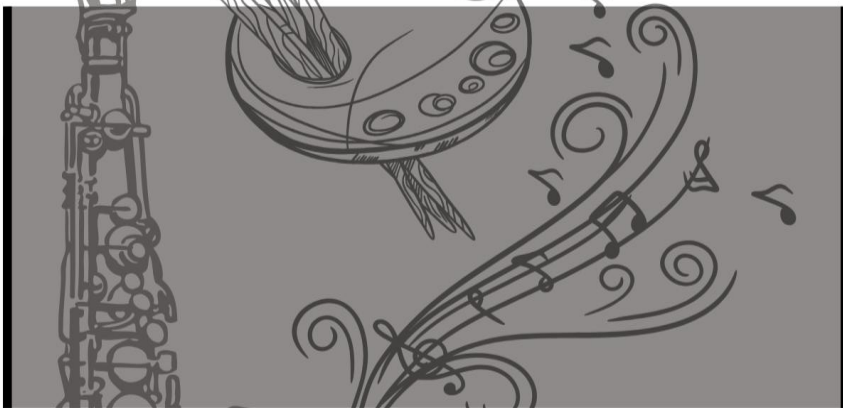
