From Pastor Mark

God's richest blessings to you in this new year! A new year is always one that is filled with possibility and hope for the future. The reason for our optimism is God's love, grace, and providence in our lives. His grace is sufficient for every need and every situation. Our optimism is not blind to the realities of pain and suffering in our world. We have a Biblical framework for the evil that we see around us. But ultimately our God of grace and mercy is in control. He has called us to be his very own in our baptism and given a living faith by the Holy Spirit through the gospel of Jesus Christ. He is in charge and he will work all things together for our good in and through our Savior in accord with his good and gracious will. (Romans 8:28)

The beginning of a new year is an opportunity for self-examination. Because we are God's people in the process of sanctification, there is always room for improvement in our lives. A common practice is to make resolutions to set goals to change some part of your life. Every day we have the opportunity, by God's power at work within us, to make decisions that will set us on a path of continued growth in our knowledge and love of God and love for others. His power is available to us through his Word.

Let me suggest that you look at the words that come out of your mouth. Jesus says in Luke 6:45, "The good person out of the good treasure of his heart produces good, and the evil person out of his evil treasure produces evil, for out of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaks." My beloved grandmother, GG, who lived to 102 years, had a variety of sayings. One that is very practical is "If you cannot say anything good about someone, then say nothing at all." Words are very powerful. Words can build up another or tear them down. Words can solve wars among nations, and conflict in families. So, words have to be chosen carefully, and be used in a positive manner, for the good of others.

The words we speak reveal what is in our hearts. Evidence of your faith is shown in your words. Paul says in Romans 10:9, "If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved." The content of your heart is revealed by your mouth. If your thoughts and intentions are negative, hateful, and evil, then your mouth will expose you. Monitor your thoughts. Notice that you do have control over what comes out of your mouth.

We are called in the church of Jesus Christ to build one another up. We have the opportunity to encourage one another with positive comments. Tell the other person what you admire or appreciate about them. Be a model of Christ-like love and forgiveness. There is nothing more motivating to a person than someone pointing what is right in their qualities and behavior.

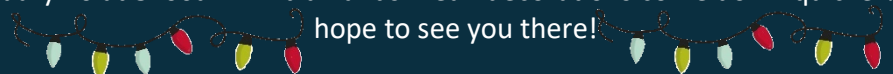
This series will include a gifts survey, Bible study on the gifts, self-evaluation tools, exposure to ministry possibilities, and more.

We are grateful to report that 15 nominations for the Senior Pastor position have been received from members of Crown of Life. This reflects the prayerful thought and care of our congregation throughout this important process. All required and pertinent paperwork, along with the complete set of Crown of Life nominations, has been carefully compiled and formally submitted to the District for review.

The District will now begin its evaluation process, which includes reviewing the submitted materials and prayerfully discerning appropriate candidates. In the coming weeks, we anticipate follow-up communication from the District, including a list of pastor recommendations for our consideration. We ask the congregation to continue to keep this process in its prayers as we await the next steps and trust in God's guidance throughout this call process.

PROCEDURE FOR ORDERING ALTAR FLOWERS PRICE INCREASE AS OF JANUARY 1, 2026
