

Hurry Up and Wait! Each year we wait for Christmas to come. Some start thinking about next Christmas right after the decorations and lights are packed away. The preparations seem to be starting earlier every year. Children want the time to hurry up and Christmas to come quickly because they anticipate getting that special gift. We all enjoy the music and the lights and the decorations. It truly is a celebration of God's love in Jesus.

"Hurry up and wait" is a common military phrase describing the experience of being rushed to complete a task or arrive at a location, only to have to wait for an extended period for something to happen. This occurs because military operations require extensive planning and coordination. While deployed with Battalion Landing Team 1/4, United States Marine Corps, I remember waiting for the commanding officer for three hours, only to have to come back later. It was very frustrating, but a very predictable part of being in the military. My time was not my own.

The entire Old Testament is a record of the people of God waiting on the Coming Messiah. The sin and death and evil in the world begged for a Savior to come quickly. The people of God anticipated His Advent as the Reigning King who would rescue them from their enemies and destroy the power of sin and death. The prophecy begins at Genesis 3:15 with God's Word to the serpent: "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring[e] and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel." This was fulfilled at the cross of Jesus Christ, the true promised child of Adam and Eve. He crushed the power of the devil, sin, and death by his dying and rising.

After the birth of Jesus, he was taken to the Temple to present Him to God. Simeon was an old man who was waiting on the Lord to fulfill his promise. It has been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death until he had seen the Lord's Anointed. A sin-sick and death-destroyed world wanted the Savior to come quickly, but he came in God's time, at the right time. Simeon held the infant Lord, the Promised Messiah, and praised God. We know his hymn of praise as the Nunc Dimittis, which is used in our liturgies.

Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace, according to thy word: For mine eyes have seen thy salvation, Which thou hast prepared before the face of all people; A light to lighten the Gentiles, and the glory of thy people Israel.

Simeon waited his whole life, faithfully in the Temple, and at last saw what he was promised. The time between a time of desiring Christ to come quickly and his appearance was a time of worship.




