From Pastor Mark

Dear Friends in Christ,

In March we have the unfolding of the Season of Lent in our Liturgical Calendar. From the Second Sunday of Lent, March 1, to Palm Sunday, March 29, the emphasis is the new life that is ours in Christ our Savior. As we grow in faith and follow Jesus, we discover more and more our need to turn from sin in our thoughts, words and deeds. Believers are keenly aware of their need for the sacrifice of Christ. We are thankful for the new life that is ours in Christ. We are mindful that we are at the same time declared saints through faith and continue to be sinners in daily need of repentance. The Holy Spirit creates hungering and thirsting in our hearts for righteousness and motivates us to seek the things of God. We place special emphasis on prayer and repentance in the season of Lent that began on Ash Wednesday.

We pray that God would renew us so that we would become truly remorseful and renewed in the forgiveness offered in Christ. We look to Jesus, who endured the shame and sufferings of the cross, and now, having won our salvation, reigns at God's right hand. Throughout the 40 days of Lent, we seek God to renew our hearts and lives in preparation for the joyous news of Christ's victory at Easter.

The modern 40-day observance (less Sundays) of Lent has its roots in the 3rd Century. The Church observed a period of fasting during the Pascha (relating to Easter), a commemoration of the redemption accomplished by Jesus Christ, including both His sufferings and His glorious resurrection. The early Church, developing in a time of persecution, also used the annual Pascha as a final preparation for baptismal candidates. They were required to fast and attend classes in Scriptural teachings and the doctrines of the Church. The fast lasted 40 days, reflecting the importance of the 40-day period in various Scriptural accounts. One Scriptural example is the 40 days of Christ's temptation in the wilderness. Examinations of the candidates were held beginning on the third Wednesday of Lent and lasting until Holy Saturday.

Midweek services provide an opportunity to set our hearts and minds on contemplating the great effort our Lord Jesus Christ performed for us by his perfect life, agonizing suffering and death, and glorious rising again to life. He is the focus of our faith.

He is the One who moves us to turn from our sins. We think on Jesus to be strengthened in faith and love.

The blessed Rev. Dr. Martin Luther writes about the Christian life in his first thesis of the "95 Theses." He says, "When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, 'Repent'" (Mt 4:17), he willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance." Repentance is the willingness to admit our sin and acknowledge the only remedy is God's - provided in His Son Jesus.

In good Lutheran tradition, we can add something new to our daily walk with the Lord this Lent. Let me suggest that you add another devotion to your daily discipline of reading God's Word and prayer. If you do your quiet time in the morning, add another later in the day, just for ten minutes. We have "Portals of Prayer" available as a resource. Other resources are on our website under Daily Devotionals at <https://www.colchurch.com/>. Lutheran Hour Ministries have Lenten devotions at <https://www.lhm.org/lent/>. Another is a Lutheran daily lectionary reading at www.sanctus.org. We are free in Christ to use our time and our efforts to grow and learn in our faith. Blessings on you!

Lent: Walking with Christ Through Suffering Toward Resurrection

During Lent, we are invited to reflect deeply on how Jesus shows us the way through suffering. He models honesty about pain, steadfast faith in the Father, and a steady movement toward resurrection and eternal life with our Triune God and our heavenly family.

Throughout Scripture, our Heavenly Father reassures us that we are never alone. He promises: "Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." (Isaiah 41:10) These words anchor us when grief feels overwhelming, and the future feels uncertain.

In Philippians 2:5-9, we are reminded of Christ's humility and obedience: "Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus... he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him...."

Jesus willingly entered into suffering for our salvation. He did not avoid the cross; He embraced it in love. And because He did, suffering does not have the final word; resurrection does. As we contemplate Christ's sacrifice during Lent, we can picture Him walking beside us in our own seasons of loss. He understands sorrow. He knows grief. He draws near to us in it. Scripture assures us: "The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in spirit." (Psalm 34:18)

For those healing from the death of a loved one, this promise is deeply personal. Christ does not stand at a distance from our pain. He walks with us, loving, comforting, strengthening, gently leading us forward in hope.


