## From Pastor Logid

As we prepare for calling a new pastor, a saying that is common in the military special operations community comes to mind. “Slow is smooth. And smooth is fast.”

Why go through the time-consuming self-study and strategic planning as a congregation? The meaning of that saying is relevant. Military operators know moving slowly helps you stay controlled, make fewer mistakes, and maintain situational awareness. Well thought out decisions can be deliberate. When your movements are smooth, you actually complete the task faster overall—because you're not stopping to correct errors or deal with the chaos caused by rushing.

The principle can be applied in the church. We know the church is established by God through his Word. All true believers in Christ make up the invisible and visible church. The Large Catechism states, “Wherefore we hold, according to the Scriptures, that the Church, properly so-called, is the congregation of saints, who truly believe the Gospel of Christ, and have the Holy Spirit.” The Holy Spirit grants faith through the means of grace given to the Church. The visible church in the world, true believers, are given the right and power to call pastors to fill the office of the Word. The Office of the Word is given to release people from sin (Matthew 18:19). The gospel proclaims that all sins are taken out of the way by the once for all sacrifice of Christ. The authority to forgive and retain sins, called the Office of the Keys, is first and directly given to the church. The gospel is proclaimed to the world and the sacraments are administered according to Christ's institution till He comes again.

The priesthood of all believers, 1 Peter 2:8-9, have the right to select and call their pastors. This is spelled out by Peter clearly. ***But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.***

Churches with a hierarchical polity reserve the right for a bishop to ordain priests/clergy and assign them to a local congregation. The bishop, as the successor to the apostles, assigns the pastor for the office of the ministry. The faithful receive the assigned priest without participating in the process. However, we learn from the Scriptures that the priesthood of all believers is given the privilege and responsibility by the Lord to call pastors to preach and teach the gospel and administer the sacraments.

The Call Manual of the LCMS, located on the PSD website <https://www.psd-lcms.org/call-manual-section-2>) states:

***God's people in a specific place, after sincere consideration and prayer, call a pastor from the larger Christian family to inspire and equip them for their ministry. The pastor's focus of service is the faithful proclamation of the Gospel and administration of the Sacraments, loving acts of pastoral care, an exemplary Christian life and concentrated efforts for the growth of the church.***

At Crown we have been working the process of self-study and are developing the strategic plan envisioning God's future for us. The strategic plan will be completed in September and the congregation will review it. Remember "slow is smooth." It takes time. The pastor, president of the congregation, and head elder are overseeing the process of forming the call committee. Once the strategic plan is approved by the congregation, the committee will announce the opportunity for members to nominate qualified pastors for the Office of the Ministry. Our District President, Rev. Dr. Michael Gibson, is involved with this process and coordinates with the call committee. He will be given a list of the congregation's nominees. He will review the list and then provide a slate of candidates for the call committee to screen. The congregation has the final decision in a voter's meeting to call the new senior pastor.

What can we do to make this process smooth and fast? We pray for discernment -- individually and together. We pray that God's will be done among us. We pray confidently that the Holy Spirit will guide the decision-making process to select our senior pastor. We pray for a "good fit" according to God's will. We ask Him to use us as His instruments to further His Kingdom and glorify Him. We are confident that God will give us the person He wants. We live by grace, with joyful anticipation about our future, knowing that God is faithfully working out his good and gracious will among us.

## From the President

COL members – A congregational update was e-mailed to all members earlier this summer. What follows is an update to that update, as we want to keep the congregation updated with all the latest updates. As we progress into the fall, there will be further updates to keep you all updated with the latest updates.

Now that most of you have given up reading anything that I write concerning updates, let me further update you.

Per continuing the consultant program, a Strategic Planning Committee has been selected. The committee consists of approximately 15 members of the congregation that have agreed to serve in that important role. That committee will develop a long range plan for COL on September 12/13 in a two (2) day seminar led by our consultant. We would anticipate a final report from the consultant sometime in late September. That final consultant's report will be shared with the congregation in mid October – likely in a specially called Voters' meeting (more specifics will be forthcoming as the calendar is finalized). At that voters' meeting we would anticipate voter approval of all the work of the consultant/congregation as we proceed with the next phase of securing a new Senior Pastor for COL. All that information – the total program/report/recommendations will serve as background for the call committee as we proceed.

Speaking of the call committee - said committee is in the process of being formed and will likely have its first meeting in early October. The call process is spelled out in specifics by the district and the committee will actually begin some of that initial activity in the ensuing weeks. Further information re that process will be forthcoming to the congregation as the call committee begins its work. The congregation will have input into that call process as all of this carries forward.

So, as you can see, the snail is moving forward on its little slime feet with breakneck speed! Your continued prayers and encouragement are important and needed as God and leadership moves COL forward in the coming months.

That's my update and I'm sticking with it – until the next update that will update this update.

Death is hard! We don't want to lose our loved ones, and we don't want to experience pain. Jesus himself said, "Now is my soul troubled. And what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour?' But for this purpose, I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven: "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again." (John 12:27-28)

Jesus teaches us, "Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. If anyone serves me, he must follow me; and where I am, there will my servant be also. If anyone serves me, the Father will honor him." (John 12:25-26)

The Apostle Paul encourages us to "Pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, steadfastness, gentleness. Fight the good fight of the faith. Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called...." (1 Timothy 6:11-12)

1. Go to your phone's app store (App Store – Apple) (Google Play Store – Google Phones) (Android App Store – Android Phones)
2. Look up "Listen Everywhere App." (This is what the app icon looks like.) 
3. Once you download the app and you arrive at church – connect to the guest Wi-Fi network
4. Once you are connected to the network, open the app there will be a tab labeled "Sanctuary." Once you click on that it will send it to your hearing assist devices if they are connected to your phone.

- 5) The lead will rotate until each couple has hosted.

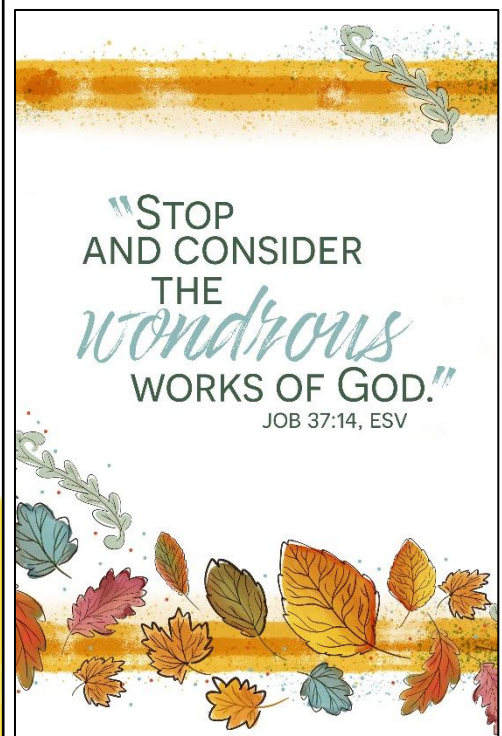
