## From Pastor Mark

Dear Friends in Christ,

It happens this year that Ash Wednesday falls on the date that Blessed Martin Luther passed away, February 18. He had traveled to Eisleben, the place of his birth, to settle a controversy. He was able to get it settled on February 17<sup>th</sup>. Michael Reeves recounts for us the following:

When he went to his bed, he prayed, "Into your hand I commit my spirit; you have redeemed me, O Lord, faithful God" (Ps. 31:5), the common prayer of the dying. At 1 a.m. on 18 February, he awoke with more chest pain and was warmed with hot towels. He thanked God for revealing his Son to him in whom he had believed. His companions, Justus Jonas and Michael Coelius, shouted loudly, "Reverend father, are you ready to die trusting in your Lord Jesus Christ and to confess the doctrine which you have taught in his name?" A distinct "Yes" was Luther's reply.

It is interesting that he died in the place of his birth. There is no significance to it except the fact that he died in the faith that he had defended. His confession to the end was that we are justified by grace through faith, solely on the basis of Christ's completed work on our behalf.

We enter the season of Lent with the understanding that our disciplines as Christians, such as prayer and fasting and imposition of ashes, are helpful to keep us focused on repentance and faith in Christ. We apply Law to ourselves and recognize our need for forgiveness, and apply the Gospel to ourself that in Christ alone we have full forgiveness of all our sins and eternal life. We cannot add anything to Christ's completed work with our sincerity and good works. We don't require "giving up" something in Lent, but keep before our eyes the suffering, death, burial and resurrection of our Lord and Savior. We remember we are mortal with the ashes, which are not sacramental, but symbolic. We are dust and to dust we shall return. So, the admonition is to repent of sin, admitting our fallenness and believe the Gospel of free forgiveness of all our sins in Christ.

The designated Saint Day is February 18 (transferred to the 19<sup>th</sup> this year because of Ash Wednesday) – Blessed Martin Luther, "Renewer of the Church" – (10 November 1483 – 18 February 1546).

## We are Not Alone: The Steadfast Love of Our Father Guides Us on Our Journey

Grief is a journey, one that can feel lonely, disorienting, and heavy. Yet Scripture reminds us again and again that God does not abandon His children in times of sorrow. Just as God leads us through the seasons of the Church Year, and this month, from Epiphany to the Transfiguration, through Ash Wednesday and Lent, He also walks with us on our journey from mourning toward joy after the loss of a loved one.

During the season of **Epiphany**, we celebrate the revelation of Jesus Christ as the Son of God—the Light who enters a dark world. God sent His only Son to reconcile us to Himself, assuring us that we are deeply loved and never forgotten, even when grief clouds our hearts.

At the **Transfiguration** of Our Lord, Peter, James, and John are given a glimpse of Jesus' divine glory. His face shines, His clothes become dazzling white, and heaven briefly breaks through earth's suffering. This moment points us forward to resurrection hope, the promise that suffering and death do not have the final word. For those who grieve, the Transfiguration offers comfort and assurance that glory lies ahead, even when the present feels overwhelming.

As we enter **Ash Wednesday**, we are reminded of our human frailty, "dust to dust," and our deep need for Christ. Yet ashes do not speak only of death; they point us to the cross and the resurrection to come. Through the 40 days of **Lent**, we reflect on Jesus' endurance, His suffering, and His victory over sin, Satan, and death. In Him, we find strength for our own journeys of loss and healing.

If you are grieving the loss of your spouse and feel alone or overwhelmed, you are invited to attend our **Loss of a Spouse Seminar** on **Tuesday, March 31, from 9:30–11:30 a.m.** This encouraging seminar offers Christ-centered support and practical guidance, including

- How to handle overwhelming emotions.
- Where to find the strength to go on.
- What to expect in the days to come.
- Biblical principles that help you deal with your grief.
- How to grieve in a healthy way that suits you.

God never intended for us to grieve alone. He surrounds us with His love and with a caring Christian community.
