From Pastor Logid

Dear Crown of Life Saints,

One of my favorite hymns is "For All the Saints" (Lutheran Service Book, #677) written by William W. How, in 1864. It is a wonderful hymn of hope and promise used throughout the church year, but especially on All Saints Day, November 1st. The hymn confesses the truth of the resurrection and the witness of the Christian saints' lives who are in heaven and those who are still on earth. Their witness stands as a beacon of hope of life eternal in Christ Jesus. It is often used for funerals and memorial services. Death does not have the final word.

For all the saints, who from their labors rest, Who Thee by faith before the world confessed, Thy Name, O Jesus, be forever blessed. Alleluia, Alleluia!

Throughout the Old and New Testaments God's people are designated as saints. God's people are "holy," meaning they are set apart by Him. They are people chosen before the foundation of the world to be his own. His love moves him to choose His people and not any intrinsic good qualities within his people. Because of God's grace His people are cleansed from sin and chosen to be in His Kingdom. God's people are holy because of God's decision and choice and not their own.

We are saints through faith in Jesus Christ. Christians are holy (set apart) and complete through faith in Jesus Christ. Listen to the Apostle Paul, writing in Colossians 1.

¹⁹ For in him (Christ) all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, ²⁰ and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross.

²¹ And you, who once were alienated and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, ²² he has now reconciled in his body of flesh by his death, in order to present **you holy and blameless and above reproach before him.**

This is all by faith. Your faith in Jesus makes you a saint. As saints through Christ, we know that He is the only mediator, through whom we approach God confidently in prayer and praise and giving thanks. So, we join with all the saints saying, "Oh, give thanks to the Lord, for He is good, His mercy endures forevers."

We know that many Christians have been martyred for their faith throughout church history. We highlight those "saints" because of their example of faithfulness, courage, and endurance to the end.

We don't appeal to them, or pray to them, or expect that they are involved in our lives in some mystical way. We praise God for the witness of those who shed their blood as a confession of faith. In today's world Christian saints are giving their lives for their testimony to Christ. We are one with them in Christ.

The Lutheran Confessions state, "Scripture does not teach that we are to call on the saints or to ask the saints for help. Instead, it sets before us the one Christ as the Mediator, Atoning Sacrifice, High Priest, and Intercessor."

Apology of the Augsburg Confession (Ap XXI:27)

But lo! There breaks, a yet more glorious day; The saints triumphant rise in bright array; The King of glory passes on his way, Alleluia, Alleluia!

The future is secure for you and all saints. We endure because Jesus endured the cross for us, rose from the dead, and by the gospel has made us his holy people. All praise and adoration to Christ Jesus!

Turn to God. Pray and spend time in Scripture. Let His Word renew your strength: "You keep me in perfect peace when my mind is stayed on You." — Isaiah 26:3

Practice Gratitude. Notice and record blessings, both large and small. Gratitude opens your heart to God's faithfulness.

Reach Out. Connect with others who may also be alone. A simple call, card, or visit can bring mutual comfort.

Set Boundaries. Share honestly what you can and cannot do this year—and give yourself grace.



Where do my mites go? 2025–2027 National Mission Grant #3 - Portable Laundry Trailer (Forged by Fire Services, U.S.) Mission Grant for \$100,700. When disasters strike, Forged by Fire Services, a disaster response organization of the LCMS Southern District, is deployed to the Gulf Coast Region and beyond. Sharing the hope in Christ, they provide human care to the victims, volunteers, and first responders affected by natural and man-made disasters. After a disaster, one of the needs of the people and volunteers are clean clothes, but there may be no facility for laundry service available. Forged by Fire Services would like to provide laundry service by obtaining a professionally built eight-station laundry trailer with all the supporting equipment. The laundry trailer would be set up in the parking lot of an LCMS church. When offering the service, the LERT trained volunteers have an opportunity to talk to the people about the grace, mercy, and love of Jesus Christ. This grant will provide funds for the purchase of the portable laundry trailer.

RECRUITING THE NEXT GENERATION

Your tithes help support initiatives to recruit and form the next generation of pastors and deaconesses. Recruitment has been called one of the most urgent priorities facing our church today.

Recently, we received an inspiring report from Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, stating: "We are grateful for our long-standing partnership with Crown of Life Lutheran Church, which has faithfully walked alongside the Seminary in encouraging future church workers. With your support, we can continue to strengthen vital relationships and ensure that more men and women hear and respond to God's call to serve."

The report highlighted how Crown's dollars will help fund the:

- **Student Recruitment Ambassador Program.** Five current St. Louis seminary students are connecting with prospective students and church communities. These ambassadors share their personal experiences and showcase the seminary's vibrant academic, spiritual and community life.
- **Called to Serve Events**. This program brings seminary representatives into congregations and schools where prospective students are most likely to be found.
- **Army of Volunteers**. A program to add 2,000 volunteers and distribute 5,000 Seminary Sunday Kits to equip lay leaders and pastors across the country to identify and encourage potential church workers.
- **Collaborative Recruitment Campaigns**. Together with Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, expand the successful "*We Are Your Seminaries initiative*." Through shared exhibit booths at LCMS events such as the Hispanic Convention, Higher Things and the LCMS Youth Gathering, the seminaries can connect with broader and more diverse audiences, including second-career candidates.
- **Strategic Partnerships**. Collaboration with LCMS campus ministries, student groups and other church institutions to identify and encourage prospective students.
- **Campus Visit Expansion**: Because campus visits remain the strongest predictor of enrollment, invest in travel and lodging support to make visits more accessible.

With continued prayers, financial support, and God's blessings, the recruitment of the next generation of pastors and deaconesses should reap a bountiful harvest. 

Technology Upgrades at Crown of Life

Over the summer, while it slowed down, the projects ramped up, here are somethings that happened over the summer in the technology world.

In June we upgraded our network infrastructure, allowing us to have dedicated networks, which have allowed us to separate devices for public, AV, and staff use. In late August, going into October, we upgraded our livestream infrastructure including new PTZ (Pan Tilt Zoom) cameras, a new video switcher, and livestream provider. Now all of our church livestreams will be on our church website! All you have to is go to www.colchurch.com and in the navigation bar is a tab labeled "watch" **OR** search www.colchurch.com/watch and that is where the church livestreams will be. We will still be streaming to YouTube as well!

Also in August, we have fully redone the chapel AV set up to mimic the Parish Hall, with new wireless microphones, as well as brand new speakers. In the choir loft, there are new speakers for the choir and those who sit in that area. Lastly in October, there were some "renovations" to the Tech Booth. I say renovations with nothing foundational happening, but more so rearranging. There is a new AV rack in the booth that allows us to have, what I call, "Video World" and "Audio World." This move gives us better space utilization, and more room for other additions if needed. There are also new microphones being implemented for the Pastors - they are now wearing "headset" microphones, something small but makes a huge difference.

Now you may think "that's a lot of stuff happening, is that it?" Actually, not quite. In November there is also a project slated for the Parish Hall. Thanks to the Church's Endowment Fund, there will be upgraded speakers in the Parish Hall, and the implementation of a "Listen Everywhere" system like there is in the sanctuary. This allows those who have hearing assist devices to send audio straight to those devices. There will also be a video feed being sent to kitchen, for those who volunteer in there to allow them to watch/participate in church as they prepare food. There will also be a change to the "audience" or "congregation" microphone in the Sanctuary that is used for our livestreams. It will be moved from the back of the room to the front, allowing for more clarity in responses from the congregation.

Again, a huge thanks to the Endowment Fund for allowing these projects to happen.

I think that covers it all, oh wait! Lighting, soon there will be a new system for how we control lights. If you've witnessed in the past the random blackouts, yeah, doesn't help with the flow of the service. This new system will mitigate the amount of random blackouts.

Now that covers it all. Next year, not so much installation/upgrades but more so training and procedures.


