From Pastor Mark

Fellow Believers in the Resurrection,

The book of Genesis teaches us the fact that God created the universe in seven days. Each day had specific works of God. He called everything into existence from nothing by His almighty Word. "Ex-nihilo" is a Latin phrase meaning, "from nothing." In other words, In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth, everything He created, including all time, matter, space, and the invisible world was created out of nothing. We measure time with seven days, making a week. The seventh day was the day on which God rested from His creative activity.

Thus, the heavens and the earth were finished, and all the host of them. And on the seventh day God finished his work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all his work that he had done. So God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because God rested from all His work that He had done in creation (Genesis 2:1-3).

Holy week this year begins on Palm Sunday, March 29th and goes through Saturday, April 4th. Jesus' body lay in death's strong bands resting in the tomb on Saturday following the first "Good Friday." But then a new week begins on Sunday, the Day of the resurrection. The women went to prepare His body for permanent burial, but they found that the First Day of the week was really the Eighth Day of God's new creation. "Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen! Remember how He told you while He was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men and be crucified and on the third day rise" (Luke 24:5-6).

Remember in the Old Testament baby boys were to receive the sign of the Mosaic Covenant in their flesh by being circumcised on the Eighth Day. They became part of God's people with that action. The Eighth Day was something new for a person with leprosy. They would go to the priest who would declare them clean on the Eighth Day. Solomon's Temple was dedicated on the Eighth Day and the Shekinah glory of God's presence filled the Temple.

So, as Augustine wrote, "God brought it about that Christ's body rested from all His works on the Sabbath in the tomb, and that He rose from the dead on the third day, which we call the Lord's Day, the day after the Sabbath, and therefore the eighth day."

Finding Hope in Christ: Walking with Jesus through the Stations of the Cross

During Lent, Christians reflect on the suffering and sacrifice of our Lord Jesus Christ. One meaningful devotional practice that helps us meditate on Christ's journey to the cross is the **Stations of the Cross**. These stations walk us through key moments from the final hours of Jesus' earthly life, helping us remember the depth of His suffering and the greatness of His love.

The Lutheran Church, Missouri Synod, recognizes scripturally-based stations that invite us to walk with Jesus step by step as He goes to the cross for our salvation. As we reflect on these moments, we are reminded that Jesus entered fully into human suffering to redeem us and give us eternal life.

Jesus is condemned to death even though He is innocent (Matthew 27:22–26). In this moment, we see that Christ understands injustice and suffering in a broken world. Yet through His suffering, God is accomplishing our salvation.

Jesus carries His cross (John 19:16–17) willingly bearing the instrument of His suffering. Grief can sometimes feel like a heavy cross we never expected to carry. Yet Christ walks beside us and strengthens us in our burdens.

Along the way, **Jesus encounters His mother, Mary** (Luke 23:27). Watching someone we love suffer is one of life's deepest sorrows. In this moment, we see that God understands the heartbreak that comes from loving deeply in a broken world.

Simon of Cyrene helps Jesus carry the cross (Luke 23:26–27). In our own seasons of grief, God often sends others to walk beside us. The church, through prayer, compassion, and presence, helps carry one another's burdens.

Even while suffering, **Jesus speaks words of compassion to the daughters of Jerusalem** (Luke 23:27–28). Those who have experienced sorrow often develop deep empathy for others. God can even transform our pain into a ministry of comfort.

At Golgotha, **Jesus is stripped, nailed to the cross, and suffers the agony of crucifixion** (John 19:18–22). The cross shows both the seriousness of sin and the depth of God's love. Through Christ's suffering, we receive forgiveness and eternal life.

Finally, **Jesus dies on the cross** (John 19:28–30). Death is the deepest sorrow we experience in this life. Yet Christ's death defeats sin and opens the way to eternal life.

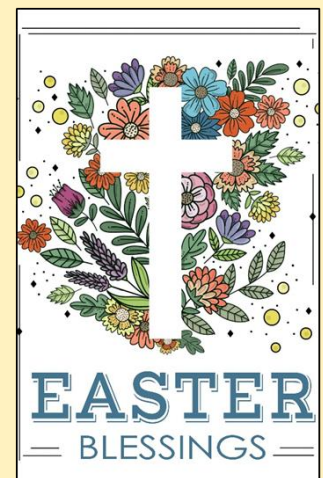
Jesus is taken down from the cross and laid in the tomb (John 19:39–42). In that moment, it appears that darkness has won. Grief can sometimes feel like living in the silence of the tomb. But the tomb is not the end of the story. Because Christ rose from the dead, we have the promise that **death does not have the final word**. Through His resurrection, we know that those who die in Christ will live again. This promise gives comfort to all who mourn.

Our Christian community is also an important source of comfort and strength as we navigate grief. If you are grieving a loved one's death, you are not alone. Please join our GriefCare group. 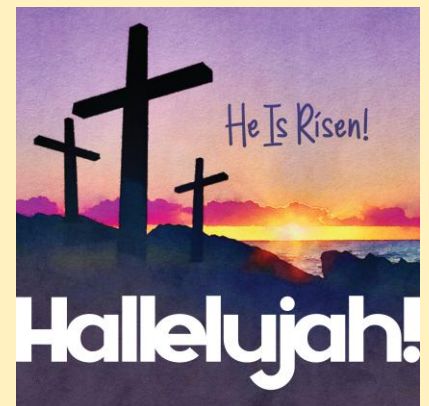

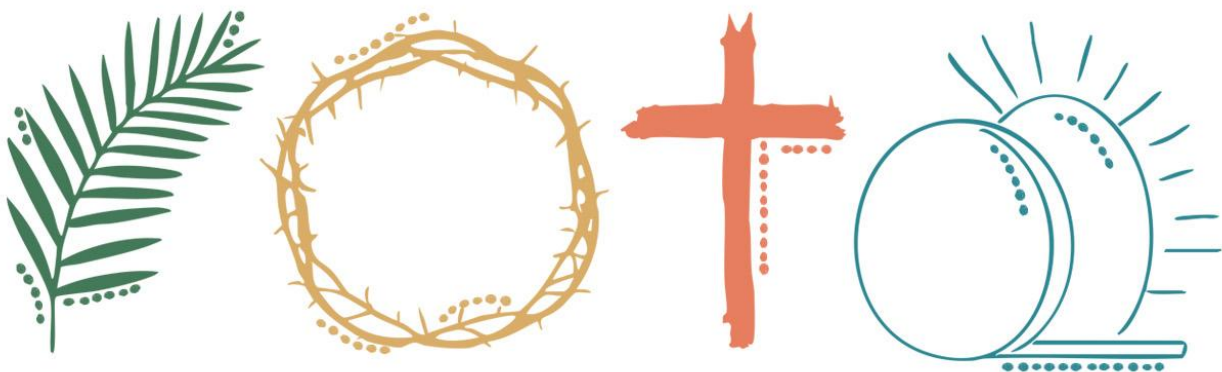
We give thanks to God for the vision of those who established this fund and for the opportunities it provides to grow and serve together.
