This fall, we will begin a sermon series shaped by the questions of our congregation and community. We also hope to offer a short-term Sunday School class where people can continue these conversations and share their thoughts together.

Let us become a church that seeks truth together — with humility, curiosity, grace, and love.

EXCITING NEWS

Mike and Alice Gyerman had always been generous donors to a variety of non-profits, including Union United Methodist Church. They continued their Christian Stewardship through the structure of their final wishes in their trust.

- McKendree University will receive funds for a nursing scholarship endowment;
- Colorado State University will receive a gift for their animal science research;
- Bradley University will receive a gift for their library;
- Preacher's Aid Society and Benefit Fund will receive a gift for their ministry;
- the United Women of Faith will receive a gift for their work;
- as well as other groups that were close to their hearts.

However, their greatest gifts will be coming to UUMC through their trust. A gift of \$250,000 to UUMC will be applied directly to the building debt. The residual of their trust (exceeding \$1 Million) will go to establish a Permanent Endowment to fund the Music Ministry of UUMC. The Finance Committee will be charged to work with a financial advisor to maximize the return to pay for the expenses of the music! The principal is not to be touched but utilized to bring glory to God through music.

This is faithful stewardship in all their assets.

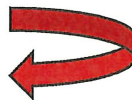

THIS IS YOUR PRAYER CORNER

John 12:18, 26-30: "I am not referring to all of you . . . but this is to fulfill the scripture : He who shares my bread has lifted up his heel against me."



"What you are about to do, do quickly,' Jesus told Judas . . . and as soon as Judas had taken the bread, he went out. And it was night."

We will never understand how Judas could have betrayed Jesus in the way that he did – we can only surmise that when Judas left the table after taking the bread, the darkness that enveloped his soul was inescapable. Judas's resentment developed gradually. He nurtured it into a level of hatred and deceit that made his betrayal of Jesus possible.

How can we avoid the kind of sin that grows in darkness and secrecy?

Acknowledge resentment – name it and expose it. Do this at the first sign of envy, anger, or self-pity. This is early spiritual intervention.

Don't rationalize resentment. Rationalization is the soil where sin grows.

Practice small acts of repentance – it is a daily "sweeping of the heart."

Stay connected to people who care for you and will tell you the truth.

Don't let "small sins" slide – small sins become habits that form character.

Cultivate the opposite virtue – the best way to starve sin is to feed its opposite.

Consider the following passage that captures the inner nature of Judas's sin a kind of cautionary tale - and remember that **sin grows in the dark, but it dies in the light.**

"And in the shadowed chambers of his heart, a seed of deceit took root. Though he walked in the light, he cherished a darkness that he would not surrender. Desire whispered to him in secret, and he listened more each day. His hands kept the purse, but the purse ruled his heart. And when temptation came, it found him willing; for the sin he committed in the open led to a harvest of hate that he had long nurtured deeply within."
